It Is Now To Be Placed at the
Head of a New Railway
Combination.

The Leap of Death—The San Francisco
Dynamiter Promptly Found Guilty
—The Yacht Race.

Withdrawal of Railroad Passes on
April 1st—Establishment of New
Railroad Tariffs.

PHILADELPHIA, March 16.—In reference to the matter of the sale of the majority of the common stock of the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad, which carries with it the control of that company, we are informed by an authority that is direct from President Garrett, that in the proposed sale, the maintenance of the trade of that city to be fully secured for the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad at the head of a new railway combination which will enlarge and improve the Southern and Western trade connections of that city, and also to the extent of improving the commercial relations of Philadelphia. We are further informed that while the original arrangement by which Mr. Alfred Sully might have had control of the new combination, was not carried out, Mr. Garrett has at present arranged a combination satisfactory to himself with a syndicate of railway managers and bankers, who have already fixed upon the price to be paid for the stock and the terms of payment, but certain details are yet to be arranged which will fully protect the shareholders of the railway and the material interests of the city of Baltimore, and also secure an outlet by an independent and untrammelled line through to New York. In the new arrangement the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad, having arranged on tariff based on the head of the combination with Mr. Garrett as executive chief of the organization. We are also assured that the Baltimore & Ohio telegraph lines are not to be permitted to pass under the control of the Western Union Telegraph company, or under the control of Mr. Jay Gould in any form, and under no circumstances will this be permitted. At the same time the independent telegraph system will be maintained will have arrangements with other independent telegraph lines that will extend the territory covered and the efficiency of the service. The adjustment of all these details will probably take considerable time, and will not be permitted to be consummated in a hurry, so that everything may be placed upon some basis satisfactory to the shareholders of the company and to the public interests.

Railroad Tariffs.

CHICAGO, March 16.—Representatives of the transcontinental railway lines have finished their tariff constructing labors, having arranged on tariff based on the strict explanation of the new Cullon-Regan law and another tariff designed to meet the Canadian Pacific and water competition. The first will be put into effect at once. It advances the present rates 50 per cent.

The attorneys of the several roads are instructed to present the other tariff to the Interstate Commerce Commission when appointed, and asked that the transcontinental roads be allowed to adopt it, the claim being made that the rule strictly complying with the law will drive the railroads out of the through business.

By instructions from the Eastern trunk lines, the Central traffic Association railroads are taking a vote on the proposition to continue the present live stock and dressed beef rates on the new tariff and classifications, and to reduce the rate on dressed mutton from Chicago to New York from 30 cents to 75 cents a hundred. The vote, it was ascertained yesterday, will be largely in favor of the proposition.

The managers of the Western States' Passenger Association met yesterday to vote on the reports of the general passenger agents on rules and regulations to govern the association and its business. Much of the time was given to the discussion of the payment of commissions. No settled conclusion was reached. Another meeting will be held to-morrow.

THEY WANT TO FOLLOW THE LAW.

WASHINGTON, March 17.—The members of the General Passenger and Ticket Agents' Association to-day adopted unanimously a resolution which expresses the desire of the Association to act in harmony with the Interstate Commerce law, and pledges the Association to a strict adherence to its provisions.

The convention adopted the recommendation of the National Association of Baggage Agents, that 150 pounds of baggage be fixed as the limit for each full ticket, and referred to the various local associations the recommendation of the baggage agents that the uniform rate of 10 per cent. on excess baggage be established.

A Ninety-Foot Leap.

PANAMA, Va., March 17.—A horrible accident happened yesterday twelve miles from here on the Marietta Mineral Railway. A heavy train had just passed Vincent station, when the train was divided in order to cross a more elevated track ninety feet high. The first section passed all right, when the engine bearing Engineer H. S. Vincent, Fireman Albert Bushley, Brake-man Steven Conductor Jack McCook and a passenger named Early, returned for the section men. When at the highest point of the track the engine gave a sudden jerk and plunged straight down to the abyss below, carrying all on board with it. Vincent and Bushley were severely killed. Their bodies were scarcely recognizable. Bushley had his head severed from his body and one leg off, while Vincent was under the wreck, pinned down by the heavy engine. It was nearly half an hour before he was taken out. In the meantime the escaping steam scalded his head, face and body. His recovery is considered doubtful. Brakeman Stewart was terribly scalded, and there are but faint hopes of his recovery. Early, the passenger, had both legs broken and was injured internally. He is said to be dying. The place into which the engine plunged is a yawning abyss, and the bottom of which is a rocky stream. The section which the engine was returning for had the passenger coaches loaded, and the loss of life would have been frightful had the accident happened while returning with them.

The Anarchists.

CHICAGO, March 17.—United States Attorney Grinnell has gone to Ottawa to file with the State Supreme Court his brief in the Anarchists' case. The document consists of two volumes, one on the law, the other on the facts. The first volume contains 342 octavo pages and the second 205. Solomon and Zeigler, of counsel for the defendants, accompanied Grinnell to Ottawa, where arguments in the case will be opened to-day. Grinnell closes his recital of facts with the following reference to the policy of Mayor Harrison in permitting incendiary utterances of anarchists on the Lake front and elsewhere: "If during the years preceding the Haymarket bomb and assassination meetings were openly advocated, had been dispersed, the massacre at the Haymarket would never have occurred. No better illustration of the effects of the lawless enforcement of the law is seen than in the fact that

as soon as Johann Most had suffered the penalty imposed upon him by the English law for his incendiary utterances, he left that land and planted himself on the soil of America, and that the officers of the law, because of his teachings, became martyrs for the law, instead of being officers for the Kingdom of Great Britain were officers of the State of Illinois."

In his brief on the law, Mr. Grinnell starts with the general proposition that the death of Officer Dugan was murder, resulting from a conspiracy to which all the plaintiffs in error were parties; that its general object and design was the overthrow of the existing social order, and of the constituted authorities of the law by force. This declaration of conspiracy is the key-note of the brief. To it Grinnell frequently refers, and upon its argument, and the refutation of the points raised by the attorneys for the Anarchists. The relevancy of Most's book and the quantities of explosives and red flag is contended for as showing the existence of conspiracy. The selection of the jury is gone into in detail, the case of each plaintiff called being treated separately. Unlike the brief submitted by the Anarchists, Grinnell's closes without peroration, simply stating that he believes "the evidence justifies the verdict, and that the jury is not in error, and the judgment should be affirmed."

No Passes.

PHILADELPHIA, March 17.—President Roberts of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, this afternoon made public the following official action taken by the board of directors of the company at a meeting held on the 9th instant, relative to the issue of passes:

"This company having been advised by its general solicitor that the act of Congress known as the Interstate Commerce law is intended to prohibit the use of Interstate Railroad passes, except by officers and employees of the railroad companies, the president is, therefore, directed to issue to the proper officers of the lines embraced in the Pennsylvania Railroad system, the necessary instructions to carry this prohibition into effect on the 1st of April next. He will also instruct the proper officers of the railway bridges and ferry companies embraced in the Pennsylvania Railroad system, that on and after April 1, 1887, they shall not issue passes for the transportation of persons or special cars from one State into another, or into the District of Columbia, except for officers or employees of the railway company."

All the Salt Possible.

NEW YORK, March 17.—Captain Robinson of the steamship Erin, which arrived from London to-day, brought the last news from the yachts Corcoran and Dantless, the yachts which were sent to the English coast miles east of Sandy Hook Lightship by the second officer of the Erin, who was then on duty. The captain was informed of the burning of any signals but three signals, that were shown in such a way that the officer was sure that they were not shown by the Erin. The night was clear and bright at the time was east-northeast, and blowing strong. The schooners were heading east by south. The Erin's alarm bell rang, and the officer of the Erin, for he said it was two points nearer the wind than he had ever seen pilot boats steer. The yachts were seen about midnight, and were going along under all the sail they could carry.

Prompt Work.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 17.—John E. Steites, charged with attempting to place a dynamite bomb on the track of the Sutter street cable line, was yesterday found guilty. Judge Hiram's charge was clear and strong. He said, in substance, it was not necessary to be caught placing the bomb on the track. It was sufficient to show that the person had a definite intent to place the bomb on the track. He would do the damage. The jury were only out eight minutes. The prisoner will be sentenced Saturday.

A Riot Imminent.

LONDON, March 17.—A feature of the observance of St. Patrick's day in England was the appearance of the Londoners in their wearing shamrocks. The sleet and snow storm stopped all out-door demonstrations in honor of the day. It is feared that riot will ensue from the celebration of the day at Lurgan, County Armagh, and 300 extra policemen have been added to the local regular force.

A Press Attack.

PARIS, March 17.—M. De Lesseps to-day visited President Ferry and Count Von Munster, the German ambassador. The Radical press makes a bitter attack on M. De Lesseps for calling France the natural friend of Germany, and advises him to stay at home in the future and confine himself to to enal matters.

Both of Them.

TOULON, March 17.—Mr. Aubergat, conductor of the orchestra at the Grand Theatre, quarreled with his mistress, an actress named Levy, and shot her dead just as she was buying a ticket at the railway station going from the city. The murderer then threw himself beneath the passenger train and was crushed to death.

The Pope's Congratulations.

ROME, March 17.—At the consistory to-day the new Cardinals were created. The Pope also recognized the new archbishops and bishops in Canada, United States, India and Australia. The Pope telegraphed his congratulations to him on his escape from assassination.

Lost and Murder.

NEILSTOWN, Wis., March 17.—The Wright murder trial attracts great interest. Margaret Wright, the widow of the murdered man, testified to her criminal intimacy with Allen, and of the latter's proposal that Wright and his (Allen's) wife be put out of the way with poison. She said Allen gave Wright poison at intervals until he died. Daniel Allen, the accused, denied having given the poison to Wright.

LAWTON LEAVES.

A Prominent New York Merchant Skips Out, Accompanied by Other People's Money.

The Decision in the Anarchy Cases Will Not Be Given Until Some Time in May.

The Plot to Assassinate Russia's Czar Traced to the Terrorist Branch of the Nihilists.

Discount and Disappearance.

NEW YORK, March 17.—Sheriff Grant has seized the place of business of Walter E. Lawton, 31 Broadway, who did business under the firm name of Lawton Brothers, as fertilizers, under attachments from Judge Donohue of the Supreme Court on creditors' claims amounting to \$245,000. It is charged that Lawton has absconded with his creditors, and that he has disposed of his property and taken to the West. Lawton is said to have absconded with the proceeds of the discounted notes.

The disappearance of Lawton has created a great deal of apprehension, and it is generally believed he is bankrupt. He left the office Tuesday afternoon as usual to go to his home on Hudson street, and has not been seen since. Three attachments were obtained against him to-day. The amount of his liabilities is estimated at about \$100,000.

Lawton is a widower, and the sole representative of the firm. His brother, who was associated with him, having died some time ago.

Rufus T. Kirkland, Lawton's cashier, states that Tuesday Lawton withdrew all of his funds from the different banks in which he deposited and took the money with him. Lawton, before his departure, destroyed all the books and papers of every kind from which any information could be secured as to the disposition of funds and property. Joseph D. Jones placed in Lawton's care on Tuesday day on behalf of the company \$12,000. This is also gone. Kirkland states that Tuesday he had instructed Lawton to deposit on Broadway and Wall Street and that Lawton requested him to go with him to the office of the Third National Bank and in the afternoon Lawton also asked him to obtain a blank warranty deed for the conveyance of real estate in New Jersey and to meet him at the New York Hotel. Lawton further said he had exhausted all his resources, and was not able to pay out any money in his possession. He had also taken a heavy loss through the negotiation of Lawton's paper, among the First and Third National Banks, the Bank of the Republic and the Chemical Bank. The President of the First National Bank denied that the bank had handled any of Lawton's paper. The American Express Company, which was reported to have a heavy loss, would not affirm or deny the report. The President of the Third National Bank says his institution holds but a very small amount of Lawton's paper, and that the stock is secured by good endorser. Just before leaving the city Lawton drew from the Third National Bank, on checks, \$10,000.

THE BYRNS.
