BAGGED.

The Gracks Who Have Been Doing Ogden and Salt Lake Nabbed.

A week ago last Saturday night, the gun store of Mr. Thomas Carter, on the east side of Main street was broken into, and fourteen pistols stolen therefrom, all valuable weapons, and some especially so. After the mere announcement of the burglary, little was thought of the affair and it had almost died out of the minds of the public. The police, however, kept up a constant but quiet investigation, which resulted in the capture of the robbers last night. About three days ago, they dropped on the parties, but did not make any arrests as they had not discovered the stolen articles, and were not prepared to prove their guilt. Yesterday, the cache, or place in which the stolen goods were concealed, was discovered, being an old safe on South Temple street. They examined the nest and found the pistols there tied up in a pair of red flannel drawers, which was wrapped in a blue flannel shirt. The police then searched the drawers, containing the two pistols, as far back in the safe as he could, jumped out, and made a break to run. The cold muzzle of a pistol, however, quickly checked him, and he rendered. In the meantime, the other man had tried to escape through the back window, but being met by a policeman, returned into a dark corner, and remained there until the robbers had been taken to jail.

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
