Denver, Col., 29.—The Republican's Leadville special says: Rev. Talmage visited the dance houses and gambling dens last night after the usual one dance house a girl asked him to lead a set, but he declined.

Hancock's Letter.

New York, 29.—The Express says: It was rumored to-day that General Hancock's letter of acceptance would be issued this evening, but this afternoon it was definitely learned that the letter will not be finished to-day. It is believed the issuance of the letter only awaits the arrival of copies of Mr. English's, so that both may be issued simultaneously. The Express reports this afternoon that Gen. Hancock's letter has been ready and in print for several days. It is understood to be short. From persons believed to have a general knowledge of its substance, it is gathered that its chief points are: The president's duties are chiefly executive, and that the President must obey the Constitution as the supreme law of the land and obey and enforce the laws of Congress, whose duty it is to repeal laws when it is found that they have been obnoxious; that the political results of the war must be accepted and upheld in good faith, and the constitutional amendments and laws enacted in pursuance thereof must be fully respected; that the broadest democratic ground will be taken on the Chinese question; that Columbia is the seymon and home of the oppressed of all lands, but she will not tolerate the enslavement of labor in any form, whether by foreign or local contract; that the duty of the President is to make recommendations to Congress to be pursued in no narrow, but in a thoroughly national sense, and as local interests may conflict, the only one of reconciling matters over which the executive may dispose belongs to Congress, the law making power.

POLITICAL.

Garfield and Arthur Get Another Nomination.

Republican Bolters in Ohio, Etc.

Portland, Me., 29.—The democrats of the first congressional district have nominated Samuel J. Anderson for representative, and the greenbackers of the same district have endorsed the nomination.

Toledo, 29.—Republicans of the sixth congressional convention to-day nominated Hon. J. R. Riddle.

Pittsburg, Pa., 29.—The independent people's labor convention assembled in Sharon, yesterday, to select candidates for president and vice-president of the United States.

W. H. Taylor, chairman of the national committee, called the convention to order. B. Smith, of Virginia, was chosen chairman, John S. Jones, of Pittsburg, secretary, A. committee on credentials was appointed.

Each state being entitled to fifteen votes. The convention then went into nominations. Taylor, of Cleveland, presented the name of Senator William Phillips, of Virginia, seconded by B. Smith, of New York, presented General Hancock; seconded by Johnson, of Iowa, Linden, of Maine, presented Gen. William S. Holman, of Virginia, seconded by B. Smith, of Colorado, Garfield, 5, Hancock 7; Connecticut, Weaver 5, Garfield 10; Virginia, Hancock 15; Illinois, Garfield 15; Weaver 5; Indiana, Garfield 15; Iowa, Hancock 2, Garfield 13; Michigan, Garfield, 12, Hancock 1; Weaver 2; Maryland, Hancock 9, Garfield 6; Maine, Hancock 1, Garfield 2; Weaver 12; New Jersey, Garfield 5, Hancock 10; Weaver 5; Kentucky, Hancock 12, Garfield 3; Pennsylvania, Garfield 10, Hancock 2; Weaver 3; West Virginia, Hancock 10, Garfield 5; New York, Garfield 10, Hancock 10; Garfield 10, Hancock 10; Hancock 5; total vote cast; 225, Garfield received 25 majority over all.

The nomination was then made unanimous. General Arthur was nominated for vice president by acclamation, after which the convention adjourned amid great enthusiasm.

Cleveland, 29.—The republican bolters of this district, to-day, nominated C. B. Lockwood for Congress, hoping for the withdrawal of Amos Townsend, the regular nominee.

The bolter central committee has issued a strong manifesto charging the regular convention with torturing free speech and making a nomination, regardless of the people's wish, by force and fraud. Lockwood, the bolter's nominee, is a steadfast and prominent republican, and the manifesto has created a profound sensation in political circles.

Galveston, 29.—The democratic congressional convention of the Fifth District nominated Seth Shepherd.

Chester, Pa., 29.—The republicans of this district nominated Wm. Ward for reelection to Congress.

Portland, Me., 29.—Bolters from the regular greenback district convention organized with Stephen Jones, chairman, and appointed a committee of five to call a general convention, if deemed necessary, for the purpose of nominating a pure greenback candidate for Congress. Resolutions were adopted alleging that primaries had been packed by the regulars, and protesting against General Anderson's nomination.

Wheeling, W. Va., 29.—The democratic state convention at Martinsburg concluded its session to-day. The committee on state officers nominated: Governor, Jacob J. Jackson; auditor, Joseph S. Miller; treasurer, Thomas O'Brien. Judge supreme court, Thomas Greer; attorney general, C. O. Wall; superintendent of schools, B. L. Butcher; presidential electors-at-large, E. W. Wilson and E. G. Cracraft.

Denver, Col., 29.—Score in the walking match at 9 o'clock p.m.—Waldron 210, Skipper 219, Cummings 194, Newberry 200, McCarty 205.

The joint track of the Denver and South Park and Denver and Rio Grande railroads is finished to Leadville. Trains will be running into the city. The main branch of the Denver and Rio Grande road is now complete and trains running to Manitou.

New York, 29.—The large building at West and Bank streets, occupied by the Domestic Sewing Machine Company, and several other firms, was partly destroyed by fire to-night. Loss, about \$5,000.

New York, 29.—S. M. Brannaman, of Jacksonville, Florida, was today committed to the Tombs on a charge of forgery. The intention was to put up bogus documents as collaterals for borrowed money with which to move an orange crop. He had made a partial arrangement to this effect and about \$25,000 of bonds are in the hands of merchants innocently entrusted to aiding the scheme.

St. Louis, 29.—James B. Lewis, an amateur, beat General Erich once shot Bogardus for the champion whip in the pigeon shooting match, to-day, by a score 91 to 75.

Buffalo, 29.—A disastrous fire occurred last evening on the south and of the creek, extending over an area of a quarter of a mile long and 600 feet wide, destroying mills and factory property to the value of \$225,000; insurance \$125,000.

New York, 29.—Homer won the three mile single scull race, to-day, in 20:55. Lee second, in 21:15.

Dr. Tanner.

New York, 29.—At 3:30 this afternoon, Dr. Tanner's pulse was regular at 72, temperature 98.1, and respiration 15. His strength, as tested by dynamometer, was 80 kilograms for the right hand and 72 on left. Dr. Gunn then applied the sphygmograph to his wrist and said the tracings were as good as could be expected. At 4 o'clock a doctor walked to the lower hall where his weight was found to be 127½ pounds, a loss of half a pound in twenty-four hours. He drank four ounces of carbonic acid water and then took a dose of medicine mixed with blackets, the air being cool.
