TELEGRAPHIC
THE ELECTIONS.
Jubilant Republicans and Low-spirited Democrats.
Republicans Dispatches Claim Wonderful Republican Gains in Indiana and Ohio.
Returns Coming in Slowly.
He Who Laughs Last Laughs Best

Ohio.
Cincinnati, 12.—The vote began very early, and at 11 p.m. the number of lots in the boxes in many precincts exceeded the total vote of last year. Business is practically suspended, and no trouble up to the present time. The polls are closely watched everywhere. Very little searching is done. Republicans regard the heavy vote as an unfair favor.
The vote polled today is 50 per cent. less than ever polled before. The militia, called out by Mayor Jacobs in anticipation of trouble, were kept all day in the armory, and discharged when the polls closed.

Chicago, 12.—Complete returns from Hamilton County give Townsend, republican, for secretary of state, a majority of 2,037; McIlvaine, judge of the supreme court, republican, 3,219. Three precincts have given a democratic majority of 111 last year.
Comparing the vote on judges of the supreme court with that of governor last year, the south shows a democratic gain in the county of 237. Butterworth's, republican, majority in the First District, about the same.
Clinton County, republican majority of 1,424, a gain of 74.
Columbus, 12.—Reports from all over the state indicate that the weather is fine and the full strength of the party is coming out. Republicans now claim the gains are sufficient to carry this city, though the county will undoubtedly go democratic. The vote of employers of manufacturing establishments is almost uniformly republican. But little searching, cautions are closed and there is no drunkenness. It is as quiet as election day ever known. John G. Thompson says victory will go for the democracy if a fair vote is had. The better men of both parties have taken active interest in politics for years appeared early at the polls, and have shown active interest ever since. The prohibition vote worth mentioning in this locality.

Whirling, W. Va., 12.—Returns from the state committee come slowly, and there is nothing as yet, which indicates a change from last year's vote. Returns from several precincts of this city and county indicate that republicans have made decided gains, and all indications point to a largely increased vote throughout the state.
NEWARK, N. J.
The city election resulted in average republican majorities of about 2,000.
Republicans elect 11 aldermen, democrats 6. The common council will stand 15 republicans to 10 democrats. Republicans also gain four members of the board of freeholders. The German vote is strongly republican.

Chicago, 12.—Inter-Ocean's Washington special: The streets are crowded around the bulletin boards and there is much excitement. The first returns received are being very favorable to republicans, they are correspondingly elated. At democratic headquarters the managers look blue and confess that they have no cheerful news to offer that which republicans are receiving.
11:30 p.m.—From a special: The greatest interest has been manifested during the day in the result of the elections in Indiana and Ohio. Crowds of people were gathered in front of the bulletin boards. Elaborate preparations had been made for the crowd in front of the Times and Tribune offices, while the democracy gathered in front of the Sun and World offices suddenly dispersed.
New York, 12.—The Herald says: The vote is so close in both Ohio and Indiana that it is apparent that they have no cheerful news to offer that which republicans are receiving.

Indiana.
Indianapolis, 12.—Returns from seventy-five precincts show a republican gain of 4,701. With the same ratio of gains in the state, the republicans would have a plurality for governor of 1,000.
At midnight the indications are that Porter, republican, is elected by 1,000 majority. Democrats do not concede the defeat of La Grange, but say the vote will be close, and claim the balance of the state ticket. One hundred precincts heard from show democratic gains of 230, and republican gains of 965; net republican gain of 735.
183 precincts show a democratic increase of 700, republican decrease 1,431, net republican gain of 731.
Indianapolis, 12.—The Sentinel, democratic, says: It is a striking fact that there are still over a thousand precincts to hear from. Republicans claim the state by 5,000, but the returns do not show it, and we expect the remaining precincts are heard from later will be elected by a small majority.
