SABBATH SERVICES.

On Sunday afternoon services were held in the Salt Lake Assembly Hall, which was comfortably filled. The opening hymn was the one beginning: O God, our help in ages past, etc. Prayer by Elder Royal B. Young. The choir sang the hymn beginning: Ye children of our God, etc.

APOTHECARY ON PACT said that as he understood the object of preaching was to do good, both to the hearers and the speaker. To bring forth anything that was new would require the spirit of revelation. Without that gift it would be difficult to bring forth anything new. The Lord had said, speaking of this day, blessed are they that seek to bring forth his Zion. The Latter-day Saints had proven the truth of the Lord's promise. They had been blessed by the gift of the power of the Holy Ghost, to cheer up the heart, to comfort, etc., and if he has faith in God, it will manifest itself in power when it is needed. The Latter-day Saints are not a darkness concerning the operation of this power. It imparted to some the power of revelation, as well of the past as of the future. It was the gift of seeing, constituting the recipient a seer; it was also the gift of prophecy. A person might be a prophet, and not be a seer. The Holy Ghost did not make all persons seers, nor prophets, but it operated upon many to make them seers and prophets. Things that were seen and prophesied of in the past, and which were coming to pass, had often thought of the promise, as given by the Lord, and also as it related to the present of the church, and others by the people. Do they realize the importance of the gift? He had sometimes thought they did not. They had rejoiced in the gift, but the speaker would go to God that he had more faith and confidence to approach God, that he could look into the past and the future. He feared that some were not so faithful as they should be; that they were obstinate of heart, or they would have in a fair degree, the power and gift of prophecy. It did not always require the Urim and Thummim in order to be a seer or prophet, and saw and prophesied without them. Though Enoch was the first seer mentioned as such, but the speaker did not believe he was the first seer. He believed that Adam, Abel, Enoch and others of the patriarchs were seers, holding the keys of the everlasting priesthood, and possessing power to administer in the church of God; to see things that had passed, and to prophesy to the future. There were many before the flood who were caught up as Enoch was. They possessed the priesthood, obtained through the gift of the Holy Ghost. It did not require the Urim and Thummim, his natural eye being able to see all. The Urim and Thummim were two crystal stones, set in the rims of a bow. They were material things, and the stones might be the same as the crystals found in these mountains; but they had the power of God, which the crystals found elsewhere do not possess. They gave the power to see things that ordinarily the natural eye did not see. It was not necessary for the Lord to use crystals. If he thought proper he could use wood, or any other substance to shine with his light, as the crystals had done. It was not within the power of all to use the Urim and Thummim, for the reason that some would make them. The Lord only permitted those to use them who knew how, when and why to use them, and not abuse the gift. The gift was one of the gifts necessary to the state of mortality. The gift of clairvoyance was the greatest to man, but that was in the state of immortality. The speaker had no idea that the Lord would bestow the Urim and Thummim upon all upon whom the people had looked to bestow the seership, as he did think that if they lived as they should live, the Lord would so sanctify their eyes that they could see the great things of the past, and of the future. Inasmuch as the people had looked to the seership, as he had thought the fault must be with the apostles themselves, who did not reach out to God, and get it. Elder Pratt had not yet had faith to see the past. Joseph Smith was a seer. He obtained the gift gradually. He at first had to use the Urim and Thummim, but after he had obtained knowledge of the gift he could see without the instruments. After translating the Book of Mormon he surrounded the plates and also the Urim and Thummim, but the gift of seeing remained with him. The speaker had heard him speak by the inspiration of God. He had also translated the Scriptures, and without the aid of the Urim and Thummim. There were some in the church who did not understand the difference between those who were seers without the use of the Urim and Thummim, and those who needed those things. The speaker thought it was the privilege of the first presidency and the apostles to be seers without having the Urim and Thummim. They had the right to the gift, and could obtain it if they would live in the way that it was necessary for them to live. The Lord had ceased for a time giving further revelation through the head of the church for the guidance of the people, but he had given special revelations to individuals, and also had the privilege of obtaining revelation for themselves. After the saints had been tried with the relations that have already been given, and if they proved faithful, then would they be given other portions of God's word. The greater things of the Lord would be made manifest. The same Urim and Thummim that had been used by the ancient Egyptians, would come forth, and be given to some one, probably the president of the church, who would translate the ancient prophecies and will of God into the English language for the benefit of the church of God. When that time should come, the speaker could not say exactly when it would be, but he believed it of the righteousness of the people, when sin and wickedness were done away. If one could say when those things would be accomplished then he would tell when the great revelations that have been promised, would be given to the world, Elder Pratt referred briefly to some ancient instances of which there is record, of the use of the Urim and Thummim, and the power of the instruments, and in closing, said there was nothing that the Lord would withhold from his saints if they live uprightly before him.

The choir sang an anti-b. and Elder O. W. Penrose pronounced a benediction.

SHOT.

A Three-Year Old Child Shot Dead by a Five-Year Old Boy.

Yesterday afternoon one of those accidents of such frequent occurrence of late took place. Mrs. Dave Williams was visiting her friend Mrs. Thomas Parsons, in Commercial street. Between 3 and 4 o'clock she was sitting in a room and her child, about 8 years old, was standing in the doorway, a few feet from her, when a 5-year-old boy of Mr. Parsons came close up to him with a little brass loading pistol in his hand, pointed it at him, fired and shot the child dead. Mrs. Williams saw the pistol pointed at her little son, and said "take care," but the words had hardly left her lips when the pistol went off. The ball entered the left breast, just above the heart, and ranged down, it is supposed entering the heart, as the child expired almost instantly.

An inquest was subsequently held over the body at the place where the accident occurred. The facts brought out were to the effect that the little boy had found a small pistol which belonged to an older brother behind an old counter in his father's place. He took it out, cocked it and fired it with the result stated. He told himself that he did not know there was any powder in it and stated that he had once had a little one of his own and fired at himself, and it did not hurt him. The jury returned a verdict in accordance with the above statement and held that the little boy was not accountable for the occurrence.

Mrs. Williams was nearly distracted at the occurrence, this being her only child, having lost the others by diphtheria. Her husband was at the inquest and was telegraphed for. Mr. and Mrs. Parsons are also terribly distressed over the occurrence. The little boy could not possibly have known of the danger, and is yet unable to realize what he has done. He is in short clothes and was playing about the house in the evening, frequently referring to the matter, but in such a manner that showed he was unconscious of any wrong whatever.

While no one can be held responsible for this occurrence, there is still blame to be laid. The father is to be blamed for not knowing the location of the pistol where it could be obtained by the little boy is blamable for great carelessness.

THE BINGHAM BLAZE.

A Terrific Fire and Heavy Losses in the Old Reliable.

From our correspondent "Liberal" we obtain the following facts concerning the fire at Bingham on Sunday night. It broke out about 7 o'clock in the evening on Main street, in the rear of one of the buildings below the drug store, the same building which was occupied by Charles Moore when he shot John Kempe last fall, but which was occupied by John Murphy and owned by Mrs. E. Griffin. Murphy had been over looking some of the papers, making a general overhaul of the accounts. Just before retiring he had heard the cry of fire, and raising the window saw where it was, encountered the fire in his face. A strong wind was blowing at the time down the canyon, which forced the flames in that direction, carrying everything before it like dry stubble. It took every building down to Smith's drug store, the first which Mr. Murphy got out of the fire, and the flames were not extinguished until the morning. The fire was caused by the chimney of the old Bingham Hotel, which had been blown out by a regular hurricane, came up the canyon, sweeping the burning coals and cinders along with it, and setting fire to the rear building of the drug store. It then reached across to the brewery, from which point the breeze raged right and left, sweeping everything before it until it reached the east of the old Bingham Hotel, which was owned by Mrs. E.
