

TELEGRAPHIC

"BILLY, THE KID."

Particulars of His Daring Capture.

Los Vegas, N. M., 18.—Positive and reliable information reached this city early this morning, by messenger, in regard to the killing of the notorious "Billy, the Kid," at Fort Sumner, 120 miles distant on the Pecos River, at 11:30 last Saturday night. "Billy" had been stopping with the Mexicans in that vicinity, disguised as one of them, ever since his escape from Lincoln County Jail. Sheriff Garrett, sheriff of Lincoln County, has been on his track for some time, and on the day above mentioned arrived at Fort Sumner, having been put on the track by some Mexicans. He had to threaten their lives in order to get them to divulge the Kid's whereabouts. About 12 o'clock, midnight, Sheriff Garrett entered the room of Pete Maxwell, a large stock owner residing at the fort, and supposed to have knowledge of the fugitive's exact whereabouts. Garrett had not been in the room over twenty minutes when the Kid entered in his "cocking feet, knife in one hand and a revolver in the other. Garrett, thinking him not dead, fired again, but missed him. Had his first shot failed he would have been riddled with bullets, as the "Kid" is known to have been terribly desperate and very accurate in aim, when in close quarters. His death is hailed with great joy throughout this section, as he had sworn he would kill several prominent citizens and had already killed fifteen or eighteen men.

Foreign Notes.

Paris, 19.—A dispatch from Stax reports that during the bombardment and capture 400 Arabs were killed and 400 wounded. South Luis is very much disturbed.

London, 18.—The House of Commons again went into committee on the land bill, to-night. Clauses 42 to 45, inclusive, were passed. A discussion on the 46th clause began, when Gladstone moved to report progress. The opposition and the home-rulers opposed this motion, until Gladstone obtained the object of the motion, which was to allow the House to go into committee of supply. Gladstone's motion then carried—115 to 58.

Cork, 18.—Justice Barry, in opening the session of assizes, to-day, said the condition of the country, as displayed by the crimes committed, could not be regarded by any right-minded man without alarm.

Constantinople, 19.—In compliance with the Sultan's order, Sheik Ul Islam and forty ulemas are examining the documents connected with the recent trial of Midhat Pasha and his associates. They will have to decide if the sentences are in accordance with the religious laws.

Montreal, 19.—Fifteen hundred pilgrims from Vermont visited the Church of Notre Dame de Londen here, yesterday. Quite a number were arrested in the evening for drunkenness.

Buenos Ayres, June 24.—The American ministers here and at Santiago, Chili, have overcome all difficulties attending the settlement of the boundary question between Chili and the Argentine Republic. The two governments have agreed to finish the settlement by treaty, without arbitration, and the majority in both the Chilean and Argentine Congresses will support the treaty.

The garrison of Arica, routed the forces of Calderon. People who are in Caspez, is organizing for further guerilla warfare and annoying operations in the interior.

London, 19.—On the preliminary trial of the steamer Servia, a flaw was discovered in the crank. A new shaft will be fitted.

Patrick Egan has purchased the Dublin Irishman, thus placing the whole of the national journals in Ireland under the control of the League.

Berlin, 19.—The statement that General Scobelevf went to Paris to sound France in regard to a Russian alliance is confirmed here. General Scobelevf's overtures, however, failed. A detective sent to watch the secret meeting at Kieff was killed. Similar murders abound in Russian provinces, whether the nihilists have transferred their activity from the capital.

Paris, 19.—Don Carlos has formally protested against his expulsion from France as being uncalled for by any act on his part. Don Carlos has started for England.

Guitteau's Premeditation.

Washington, 19.—A southern politician of some prominence has informed the postmaster-general that on the 15th day of May, he, in company with another gentleman, was visiting the state department, where he met in the corridors a man who he knows was Guitteau, accompanied by a tall, slender man. Guitteau was overheard to say to his companion in a very angry tone, "They have put me out of the White House; I will show them whether I can get even with them." Next day, according to Guitteau's confession, he purchased the pistol.

Dean Stanley Dead.

London, 19.—Dean Stanley died last evening of erysipelas. The Archbishop of Canterbury arrived in time for a few parting words. Dean Stanley's sister, Canoness Farrer and Jones, and several members of the dean's household were present at his deathbed. He remained for some time in a semi-unconscious condition until he died.

The News says no living divine will be more deeply regretted or widely missed than Dean Stanley.

The dean will be buried beside his wife in Westminster Abbey.

Suicided Nihilist.

New York, 19.—Herald's St. Petersburg. It was stated at the ministry of foreign affairs to-day, that the person found dead in the cemetery on Friday morning was the nihilist who, like Kouskoff, had been chosen to assassinate the Czar, who, rather than obey the order, committed suicide.
