**CAPTAIN JACK HOWITZERED.**

Elsewhere is published a dispatch from Chicago which tells of the killing of Captain Jack, a White River Ute, at Fort Washakie, Wyo., on Sunday; but it gives a very incorrect idea of the manner of his taking off. With commendable enterprise the *Carbon County Journal*, published at Rawlins, secured full telegraphic particulars of the affair and issued an extra on the strength thereof. The *Journal* says that Jack left Washakie several days ago, ostensibly "to go to White River, but it seems he only went a short distance on the south when he returned. News of his presence here being reported this afternoon to Col. Mason, commanding the post, he immediately ordered Lieut. Morgan and a detachment out to arrest him. Jack was discovered in a log hut about two miles from the post. He offered no resistance and was arrested, but when he was led from the hut he broke away and ran, succeeded in reaching a tepee, where he procured a carbine and ammunition. When called upon to come out, he positively refused. After using every means that could be suggested to induce him to come out and surrender, a lariat was thrown over the top of the lodge for the purpose of pulling it down. Jack, however, did not believe in being unearthened in that way, and fired upon Sergeant Richard Casey, Troop "K," Third Cavalry, who was holding the end of the lariat, killing him instantly. Lieutenant Morgan deeming it unwise to unnecessarily expose his men by keeping them close enough to fire ball cartridges into the tepee, realizing that Jack was well armed, withdrew them a short distance and sent to the post for a mountain howitzer, which was quickly on the ground, loaded with shell and shot fired into the tepee, resulting in Jack's death as well the demolition of the lodge. A number of Snakes and Arrapahoes witnessed the firing of the howitzer and Jack's death. They do not seem to be visibly affected by his demise and very little excitement is manifested among them. Colonel Mason will use the utmost vigilance to quell any disturbance that may arise. At a late hour Sunday night the excitement among the Indians was reported to be somewhat increasing. No serious trouble is anticipated.
