TELEGRAPHIC

An Editor Punished.

Dublin, 16.—E. Dwyer Gray, member of parliament and proprietor of Freeman's Journal, was today sentenced to three months' imprisonment and £500 fine for contempt of court in publishing a letter of O'Brien, editor of United Ireland, stating the jury which convicted Aynes of the murder of John Dolougherty, of being drunk on the night previous to the day the verdict was given, and an article commenting thereon. O'Brien and Dwyer were put out of court. Gray, after being sentenced, was handed over to the coroner. The latter evinced some reluctance to take charge of him, but the judge called upon him to do his duty. The coroner, whose intervention was necessary because Gray is high sheriff of the City of Dublin, then conveyed the prisoner to Richmond prison. Gray, at the expiration of his term, must find surties for himself for £500 and two others for £200 each. The decision of the court caused a great sensation. Gray was lord mayor of Dublin for '80, and was nominated the second time for '81, but declined the nomination.

Dublin, 16.—Lord Mayor Dawson has arranged to call a special meeting of the corporation on Monday with the view to considering measures to secure the release of Gray. Crowds assembling around the statue of O'Connell and speeches expressing indignation at the sentence are being made. London, 16.—Collan, member for Louth, has given private notice that he will, to-morrow, call attention to the sentence of Gray. Telegrams have been sent to Irish members at present in Ireland to return to London to participate in the debate.

Parnell Preaches.

Dublin, 16.—The city hall was densely crowded to-day on the occasion of the presentation of the freedom of the city to Parnell and Dillon. Nearly every mayor in Ireland, except the mayor of Belfast, was present. George, radical member of Parliament for Sunderland, and all home-rule members of Parliament, were also present. Conservative members of Dublin municipality were absent. When the roll of the corporation was called, at Gray's name the whole audience rose and cheered enthusiastically for several minutes. The lord mayor declared that Gray's sentence was equivalent to six months' imprisonment. He advised the people to be most careful and guarded in their language, as they were in the midst of a great crisis. Parnell, returning thanks to the corporation for the freedom of the city, said: "In view of recent events it was clear that liberty of speech no longer existed in Ireland. He and his associates, however, would take care to bring the subject before the Commons at the first opportunity. Meanwhile, the Irish party peaceably continue to educate the people to govern themselves, and would advise them to accept whatever reform might be offered them, while pushing on towards legislative independence. He advised the higher classes while they had time to join in endeavoring to bring about a better state of affairs. The people could no longer tolerate their present degradation." Dillon followed Parnell. He quoted statistics showing that Ireland, especially Dublin, had been economically injured by the union.

Political.

Columbus, Ohio, 16.—Democrats of the Fourth District nominated John Evans for Congress.

Chicago, 16.—Evening Journal's Geneva Lake, Wis., special: Chas. J. Williams was renominated in the congressional convention of the First District to-day on the first ballot.

Tuscola, Ill., 16.—Greenbackers of this congressional district nominated Dr. J. C. Barber.

Chariton, Iowa, 16.—Greenbackers of the Eight District nominated State Senator D. M. Clark.

Windsor, Ill., 16.—Greenbackers of the Seventeenth District nominated F. Gorley for Congress. He declined and another candidate is likely to be held.

Chicago, 16.—Greenbackers of the Ninth District nominated Barnard, of Kenosha.

Rockford, Ill., 16.—Greenbackers of the Twelfth District met yesterday and adopted a platform, but a journey without nominating on account of a telegram from Geo. Sigler, that he would be an independent candidate of republicans, and the greenbackers did not nominate.

Marshall, Iowa, 16.—The democratic state convention assembled at 11 a.m. A temporary organization was effected, chairman, Judge W. C. James. Committees were appointed, and recess taken.

H. F. Bonarden, of Johnson County, was nominated for clerk of the supreme court; L. A. Palmer, of Henry, for supreme court reporter; Senator Charles E. Brownson, of Delaware, for judge of the supreme court. A telegram was received announcing the death of Senator Hill, and a committee to draft resolutions to the bereaved family was appointed.

Assassinations.

Chicago, 16.—The western expert as a politician is holding a harmonious session here to-day with the purpose of restricting their production the coming season, as the old organization there. There is no doubt they will succeed.

Ploughkeepsie, N. Y., 16.—A gravel train on the Erie Shore Railroad, while making a flying switch, jumped the track, and knocked the water tank over, killing two men and wounding two fatally.

Washington, 16.—One hundred and fifty millions of 3 1/2 per cent. bonds have already been surrendered by national banks alone, and there is every reason to believe the amount received from the banks will aggregate nearly \$180,000,000.

Chicago Change.

Chicago, 16.—After the first half hour on 'Change this morning prices showed a considerable weakening, especially for provisions, which are being offered in heavy lots, buyers holding off. Prices are: Wheat, 94 cents lower; corn, a little more than a cent off. Oats 1/4 to 1/2 lower. Pork 1/4 and 1/2 lower, reaching the lowest point for some weeks. Lard 20, lower. It is claimed by many operators that the bulls in provisions are depressing it in order to gain a bottom figure. The tendency of the market has lately been pretty steadily downwards.
