Omaha, 16.--A large party of Indians, supposed to be from Pine Ridge agency, surprised a trapper seventy miles northwest of Deadwood last Wednesday, and robbed him of horses and provisions. The Indians say they are going on the war path.

Fire.

Toledo, 16.--The loss by yesterday's fire was \$375,000; insurance \$315,000, in eighty-six companies.

Elmira, N. Y., 16.--This morning the immense boot and shoe factory of Richardson & Co., a four-story brick, burned, the loss is estimated at \$300,000, insurance half. Three hundred hands are out of employment. Four firemen were seriously hurt by falling walls.

Monro, Wis., 16.--Charges of treachery are made against Stickney, the Keyes man, who in the congressional convention gave the organization to Hazelton people. Keyes and his delegates bolted and will either support Keyes or a liberal republican if one is nominated by the democrats.
