TELEGRAPHIC NEWS

Chicago Chips.

Chicago, 27.—Socialists in meeting last night heard a long address from Herr Most, who spoke in a moderate vein, about the same as in New York.

The elevated railroad scheme comes before the council this evening, and the projectors hope to get it at work at once and have it completed in two years. They will begin on the south, working toward the center of the city. The cars are to run fourteen feet high. It is claimed that if money has not been used freely in the New York legislature this plan, instead of the present one, would have been adopted. It is faster, cheaper and a far less costly method.

Chicago has become the fifth largest port of entry in the country, having passed New Orleans and Baltimore. The latest alleged candidate for United States Senator as Davis' successor, is Jesse Spalding, collector of customs at Chicago.

The sale of reserved seats for the Langtry engagement at Haverly's began today. About 200 people were in line all day.

The general managers and general passenger and freight agents of western and northwestern roads met this morning. It was decided to issue passes for the purpose of influencing trade. Rates to Missouri river points were fixed. The committee on classification was authorized of five members, one each from the Northwestern Traffic Association, from the Chicago and St. Louis Association, Southwestern Association, Iowa Truck Line Association, and the Colorado Pool, Commissioners Midgely and Carman to act on all requests for changes in classifications.

Fields' Foolishness.

Washington, 27.—A great deal of comment is indulged in here among lawyers and others in regard to the case of the San Mateo County against the Southern Pacific Railroad, and Justice Field's action in connection therewith, by his presence at the banquet given by Leland Stanford, of the Central Pacific road, to Conkling and others, of the counsel who appeared for the Southern Pacific. The unanimous verdict is that Justice Field did a very indecorous thing, to say the least, in view of the fact that he tried the case in California. No other member of the Supreme Court participated in the banquet. Indeed, it is safe to say that no other of its justices were invited.

To-day, an enormous edition of Justice, an anti monopoly organ, published in New York, was circulated in this city and nearly all officials of prominence receiving a copy through the mail. A striking article appears on its first page, surrounded by a black border, half an inch in width. It speaks of corporate aggressions in general and this case in particular. It says it requires no lawyer to detect the vice of Judge Field's decision, or favoritism towards corporations. There is no irregularity in the two systems of assessments, for both of them take the actual value of property in every case. The Fourteenth Amendment, by its language and intent, does not refer to corporations, but to men with souls, bodies, consciences and moral responsibilities. The provision of the Constitution has no reference to the case in question, and is not violated. The decision, however, conforms to the general customs of the court of which Judges Field and Sawyer preside. Californians have long ceased to seek justice in that court, in any case in which the railroad are concerned. Judge Field has been the judicial mental guide, philosopher and friend of the Central and Southern Pacific Railroads for years. He decides in their favor in the courts over which he presides, and steadily discounts from decisions of the Supreme Court when they are against them.

The Old Hat.

Lynchburg, Va., 27.—So great was the indignation among the whites at the arrival of an "Uncle Tom's Cabin" company and the five blood hounds which were paraded about the streets that it was deemed impracticable to have any performance here. Being interviewed on the cause at this late date, some old slave holders say it was an outrage and gross misrepresentation on the south, and will not be countenanced. Many say that bloodhounds were never used in most of the states. The company was generally frowned down in southern cities, and last night at Richmond, had only twelve auditors. Their play was broke up at Norfolk by public clamor.

Giants Come Together.

New York, 27.—Conkling and Everts crossed swords in the legal arena for the first time yesterday, before Surrogate Rollins; Conkling being counsel for the widow and daughter of Jesse Hoyt, to renew upon additional papers the motion to compel the executors of Hoyt's estate to pay Mrs. and Miss Hoyt out of the funds of the estate an allowance of \$25,000 each for their support, and pay the expenses of the proposed contest of deceased man's will. By that instrument it was provided that the widow should receive in lieu of dower the sum of \$1,250,000, with power to dispose of \$250,000. The daughter got an income for life of a similar amount, without any power of distribution.

Sugar Duties.

Boston, 27.—A meeting of sugar refiners and importers of Boston and vicinity to-day, was called to present the views of the trade to Congress. The following resolution was adopted:
That refiners and importers of sugar of Boston favor a large reduction in the duty on sugar, and that to accomplish this purpose we request our members in Congress to favor a schedule as follows:
On all sugars, melado, etc., not above 75 degrees of the polariscope test and not above 13 Dutch standard in color, 75 cents per 100 pounds, with a pro rata addition for each degree of polarization above 75 degrees, which upon this basis is three cents per degree per 100 pounds. In approving the graduation of duty according to the polariscope test they mean that test which is now used in commercial transactions.

It was intimated by congressmen present that differences among sugar refiners and importers had hitherto prevented action, and if a plan could be united upon there was hope of securing a material reduction in the tariff.
