

THE TUFF. Chicago, 5.—The Washingtons Polo Club, the new turf organization which is sitting up an elegant and costly track and grounds on the south side, and which will be devoted exclusively to the running horse, announces a meeting to occur June 5 to 12, 1884, and has opened seven stakes to close on November 12 next, and will open nine more to close on January 15, 1884. Not less than \$45,000 will be added to the stakes, and in no case will less than \$500 be given for a horse. The Lorillards, Dwyers and other horse owners have already signified their intention to make entries.

Second race, mile and furlong, was won by Owen Bowling, Buccanor second, Slocum third. Time, 1:57 1/2. Third race, three-quarter mile, was won by Ascender, Pearl Jennings second, Bosedam third. Time, 1:15. Fourth race, mile was won by Tarzathor, Gungarino second, Collier third. Time, 1:43. The dead heat in the first race will be run off. Monmouth Park, N. J., 5.—The weather was pleasant, the crowd large and the track fast. First race, three-quarter mile, for 2-year-olds, was won by Manitoba, Solanah second, Blue Bell third. Time, 1:17 1/2.

TELEGRAPHIC

Sir Knights.

Omaha, 5.—The following Knights Templar delegation from Nebraska left today for San Francisco. G. W. Linsinger, grand captain, and family; L. H. Kerby and wife, Omaha; Thomas Sewell, deputy grand commander, Lincoln; Henry Gibbons, Kearney; Messrs. Fish, Cain and Doragton of Pierce, and Mr. Trowbridge.

Chicago, 5.—May commandery Knights Templar of Philadelphia, 103 strong, passed through the city today en route for San Francisco to take part in the coming triennial convocation.

Chicago, 5.—The following was published here to-day: St. Bernard commandery, No. 33, Knights Templar, will start for San Francisco on Friday. The triennial of 1880 gathered in the city a large number of men known far and wide in the United States for their ability and their influence and it will do the same in San Francisco. Of course the distance will prevent as large a meeting as in Chicago, but every State in the Union will doubtless be represented by its Grand commandery, and representative men will be present from every section of the land. A large number from Boston, Philadelphia and New York are on their way thither, and form the list below which we have taken pains to see as full and as accurate as is possible. Nearly all of them will pass through our city: August 4th, the San Francisco club of Philadelphia, three Pullman sleepers which will run through via the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad, August 6th, Boston commandery, the entire train from Boston to San Francisco, six Pullman sleepers, one directors' car, dining car, baggage car, etc., Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad; August 7th, grand commandery of Iowa, from Des Moines, through in Pullman cars, via the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad; August 8th, Galesburg and Davonport commanderies, two sleepers, run through via Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad; August 8th, Boston Chapter for San Francisco via Denver, Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad, one Pullman sleeper; August 9th, Michigan battalion goes as an escort to the grand commandery of the State, four Pullman sleepers through via Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad to Denver, thence via the Denver and Rio Grande railroad; August 9th, a battalion from New York; composed of members of commanderies from Albany, Syracuse, Rochester, Buffalo, etc., four Pullman sleepers, to Denver by Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad; August 10th, Rappier commandery of Indianapolis, two sleepers, via Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific railroad; August 10, St. Bernard commandery of Chicago, seven sleepers, dining car, baggage car, commissary car, etc., through to San Francisco, via Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad; August 10th, De Molay commandery of Louisville, one car, via Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul railroad; August 10, a large delegation of Sir Knights will arrive in Chicago, via the Lake Shore and Michigan Southern railroad, from Cleveland, Toledo, Youngstown, etc., and proceed to San Francisco via Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad. These men are all active business men, deeply interested in the progress of our country, and it would be hard to estimate the importance of this triennial convocation to the general interests of the east and west. Great lines of railroad are just completed and others are rapidly approaching completion, which will develop that far western country exactly as Illinois was developed when the iron rail penetrated it. No one can form an idea of the splendid future now to be unfolded in Colorado, California, Montana and adjacent Territory. The Northern Pacific, Atlantic and Pacific and other lines will work a perfect transformation wherever they touch. All this will be seen and discussed by the keen observers who will be at San Francisco during August. Dwellers in California are thoroughly alive, not only to the social but to the business importance of this gathering. It is not only to be a reunion of the order of Templars, but an opportunity for showing that practical men are ready to embrace any favorable reports of the immense resources of the Pacific coast, and the openings for an extensive and profitable commerce with business men of every portion of the world, and they will leave no stone unturned to make this time never to be forgotten by those who had the good fortune to participate in it with low rates of fare, easy railway connections and such great attractions the convocation ought to be a large one, and undoubtedly will rank as one of the most important convocations ever held.

Toronto, Ont., 6.—The Boston commandery of Knights Templars passed through this city at 1 o'clock this morning on their way west. St. Louis, 6.—A delegation of Knights Templar of Mary commandery and Grand commandery of Philadelphia, accompanied by their wives, arrived here this morning. The Summit from St. Louis, Ivanhoe, St. Aldem and Ascalon commanderies of this city met them. From the depot they were driven to the Southern hotel, where breakfast was served. At 11 o'clock carriages were taken and they were driven through the city to the various points of interest.

Smuggling Chinese. Port Townsend, W. T., 6.—Some nine more Chinamen were smuggled in from British Columbia near here yesterday. The attempt to capture them was unsuccessful. This makes the third lot smuggled across the border within a week.

The Leather Business.

Boston, 5.—The suspension, late on Saturday, of the leather house of Hersey, Whitser & Wyman, caused considerable uneasiness. A careful analysis of the situation, however, shows no cause for general alarm. It is possible the firm will pay all liabilities in full and that Lewis W. Nutt, of Nashua, special partner to the amount of \$100,000 will be able to save a portion of the capital.

New York, 6.—A meeting of the creditors of C. H. Ward, boot and shoe manufacturer, who suspended last week, was held at his office to-day, at which Ward made a brief statement reviewing his business since it was established and the cause which led to his suspension. His liabilities were stated to be about \$145,000; assets, \$230,000.
