CINCINNATI.

The Grand Historical Pageant.

Cincinnati, 8.—The parade of the order of Cincinnati, to-night, brought out apparently the entire population of the city or at least so much of it as could be packed on the sidewalks and in windows, doorways, on housetops and special stands built for the purpose. The largest of these was on Fifth street opposite the government building where room for 5,000 was prepared. It did not begin to move till after 9 o'clock. A quarter before 10 the head of the procession reached the post office. Three patrol wagons preceded the first car side by side to clear the streets. The curb was terrible in many places; twenty-five floats illustrating ancient Roman history were exhibited. While they aroused but little demonstrative enthusiasm, they were apparently satisfactory. There was a lack of lights for the last five or six floats that detracted from their appearance.

The Coming War.

Paris, 8.—It is said Dr. Bernard, French civil commander for Tonquin, planned the expedition to Hue, ordered the bombardment of forts on the Hue river and concluded the treaty with Annam, on his own responsibility. Government is extremely annoyed. The Marquis Tseng presented to France some days ago, at the request of Chalmers Lacombe, a statement of China's proposal with reference to Tonquin. He now asks in return a statement of the French counter proposal. The interview between Tseng and Chalmers Lacombe was very cordial. It was concluded altogether to the exchange of ideas, intended to pave the way to further negotiations.

London, 8.—A Hong Kong correspondent writes that the French representative of the Hue treaty and the setting of the Torquin question is not a true one. The difficulty is to deal with China, not Annam; China alone can open the Sino-Korean trade, to make it an international water way if the European powers and America desire her to do so. This is the only possible solution of the question at present. The district of Hsi-ping is still flooded and all operations are suspended. In view of recent events in Tonquin, the German envoy to Peking, now on furlough, has been ordered to return to his post.

London, 7.—The Times of Paris says: Both the governments of France and China are equally anxious to secure a peaceful solution of the Torquin question; if it can be effected with honor, General sentiment favors the hope that all issues involved may be submitted to the arbitration of England.

The Post of Paris says: Orders are sent to Toulon and other naval stations to have transports ready for the embarkment by the latter part of September of 10,000 men for China. A dispatch from Hong Kong states that the Chinese merchants are leaving Hong Kong, not Canton, as previously reported, on account of the opening of their letters by the French authorities, who accuse them of writing to Chinese mandarins.

New Will Not Resign.

Washington, 7.—Mr. New, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury, said, to-day, that the published reports that he had resigned were unfounded. He had no notion of resigning and did not propose to talk on the subject. It is understood that those from Indiana, to have him reconsider his determination to resign. An Indianan who holds a prominent position in the treasury said, to-day, after a long conversation with New, the latter's friends would not allow him to resign. It is believed the visit of Postmaster-General Gresham to the White House, immediately upon the arrival of the President, was with reference to New's resignation. It is thought by New's friends that he should be allowed sufficient leave of absence to attend his affairs in Indiana, and they believe should this be done he will not want to resign.

The Maid of the Mist.

Buffalo, N. Y., 6.—The experiment of sending a boat remodeled after the old Maid of the Mist through the Whirlpool rapids of Niagara, was carried out successfully to-day. The start was made a few rods above the old landing at 3:40 p.m. The boat reached the whirlpool at 3:55, a distance of about a mile, and went through the whirlpool. Striking the Canadian shore the boat was again pushed into the river and passed the lower rapids, reaching Lewiston safely. There was no person on board. Forty thousand persons on the banks witnessed the trip.

Coleridge and Butler.

Boston, 7.—Chief-Justice Coleridge, to-day, in the court of Governor Butler, after breakfast, the governor presiding, the party went to the Statehouse where Chief-Justice Morton and other justices of the supreme and other courts were present, together with officers and other prominent men. An informal presentation was followed by an inspection of the buildings. After lunch Butler and Coleridge were driven to Harvard College and through the suburbs.

Yellow Fever.

New Orleans, 6.—Reports from Ships island quarantine and station say there is not a single case of sickness among the quarantine crews. Washington, 7.—The acting secretary of the navy received the following telegram from Pensacola: Since the last report no new cases among the naval force. One death at the hospital. Private Golden.

The Flatheads.

Arlee, M. T., 6.—Governor Crosby, Senator Vest and Delegate Mcginnis reached here last night from Missoula and held a council with the Flathead Indians to-day.
