New York, 27.—Noon—Stocks higher. Lackawanna up to 190 1/4, Northwestern to 99, Jersey Central to 63, Missouri Pacific to 72 1/2 and Pacific Mail to 39. Report of clearing house certificates being sold at a discount was pronounced false by Chairman Tappan, of the clearing committee.

New York, 27.—Governments steady, railways firmer; bull movement which set in yesterday afternoon made further progress to-day. Before opening of business this morning there were orders for round an unit of dividend paying stocks in broken hands. Market opened strong, and in first fifteen minutes trading there was an advance of 1/2 to 1 1/2 in solid stocks, Pacific Mail and St. Paul being most conspicuous in the upward movement. Before the first call there was a decline of 1/4 to 1/2. Near midday the market developed considerable strength, in fact became buoyant, the reaction noticed above having served merely to bring in fresh buying orders. Prices advanced 1/2 to 5/8 compared with last night's closing; this was succeeded by reaching 1/2 to 3/4.
