THE CENTURY PLANT.

Said a well known florist to a reporter yesterday, in response to the query whether he ever saw a century plant in bloom: "Only once, and that was a great many years ago, in a conservatory in London, when a plant, generally supposed to have attained the age of 100 years, began to show signs of life by sending out a stem in the centre, which grew from seven to eight inches daily. It at once began to attract general attention. The stem grew larger every day. The plant was moved from place to place, for the glass roof was not high enough, until as a last resort it was placed under the cupola roof, and, in order that its progress might not be retarded, the glass was removed and the roof raised. When the stem had attained a height of about forty-five feet, if I remember rightly, it stopped growing, and numerous small branches grew out of the main stem, each of which was topped with a cluster of magnificent greenish-yellow flowers, forming a solid bush of beautiful flowers of about ten feet in height. It seemed to me all London flocked to see that flower, and it was the topic of conversation everywhere."

"Is it a fact that they bloom only every one hundred years?" "That's a mistaken idea, which has long ago been exploded. The American aloe, or century plant, as it is commonly known, will sometimes bloom when but twenty-five years old. It altogether depends upon the climate and upon the care. At times it will not bloom unless it has attained the age of 100 years, but there are not many aloe in northern climates which attain such an age."

"Are they a popular house-plant in this region?" "Yes, they are growing in popularity every year, but as a rule people do not know how to treat them, and the consequence is that they die before they are any kind of an ornament."

"What do you consider a proper mode of treatment of that plant?" "In the first place they must be placed in a wooden pot, pan or keg, earthenware pots are liable to be injurious. Before planting them it is essential that the drainage should be perfect—say three large round holes in the bottom, and before placing the earth in the vessel a quantity of broken crockery or pebbles at the bottom will improve its drainage. It also requires constant watering, and a great deal of care and attention."

"Will a century plant bloom more than once?" "No, sir; after the disappearance of the flowers the plant withers and dies, and no care in the world will save it."—Cleveland Herald.

WRESTLING Tournament.

Mr. JOHN BASTIAN, Of this city, is making arrangements for a Grand ENGLISH AND CORNISH Wrestling Tournament, To be held at WASHINGTON SQUARE, On the 5th, 7th and 8th of July.

This Tournament is free for all Wrestlers in English and Cornish style, the entries being limited to forty-eight participants. The wrestling must be done in loose jackets, which will be furnished when necessary, catching the belt, or below the belt, being a foul. Three points constitute a fall, that is, two shoulders and one pin, or two pins and one shoulder, the falls to be decided by three judges appointed by the Proprietor, the records of the wrestling to be kept by a committee of four, the Tournament to be further subject to the usual rules governing English and Cornish Wrestling Matches, to be produced at the time of the exhibition. The prizes amount in all to \$310, to be divided as follows: FIRST PRIZE, \$150; SECOND, \$100; THIRD, \$75; FOURTH, \$50; FIFTH, \$25 and SIXTH, \$10, the money to cover the same being now on deposit in one of the banks.

This is a new and novel entertainment for this place, and one which has never failed to bring liberal patronage and enthusiastic attendance, at other places where such tournaments have been held. Everything thus far promises for the tournament a grand success. It is expected that wrestlers will take part in the tournament, and patrons of this sport will be present from Idaho, Montana, Colorado, Nevada and California. Everything possible will be done that may add to the convenience of the participants and the comfort of the spectators, and to prevent the occurrence of anything that might tend to affect the good order and propriety of the entertainment. The list for entries will be open until the first day of the exhibition.
