DAILY LIST OF CASUALTIES.

An Earthquake-The Patti Divorce-Inventors' Exhibition-A Suicide-A Marriage.

Egypt.

DONGOLA, November 15.—Gen. Wolsey left here in a pinnace to-day to inspect the depots and hasten the advance of troops.

CAIRO, November 15.—A dispatch from the Mudir of Dongola says: That a man who has just reached here from Khartoum reports the Mahdi has established himself at Amderman, on the western bank of the White Nile, a few miles from Khartoum, the Egyptian soldiers stationed there being compelled to retreat to Khartoum. The Mudir asks for more ammunition. He has only 192,000 cartridges.

PARIS, November 13.—Prime Minister Ferry communicates dispatches to the cabinet this morning from which it would appear that while passing from Khartoum to Berber, Gen. Gordon was shot dead.

LONDON, November 13.—Government believe Ferry's dispatches alleging the killing of Gen. Gordon are a revival of the old rumors current some days ago.

Casualties.

DENVER, November 13.—At 10 o'clock this morning, as the train from Graymont, on the Colorado Central railroad, was drawing into Beaver Brook station, two rear cars were thrown from the track down a five-foot embankment. Several passengers were painfully injured, none fatally.

BOSTON, November 13.—A dispatch received by the Merchants' Exchange to-day dated Pernambuco, November 12, reports the loss of the ship Andrew Johnson, Captain Kellerau, of Thomaston, Maine, while on a voyage from Dalem to Hamburg. She collided with the British ship Thirlmere, Captain Smith, from San Francisco, for Queensown, and sank with seventeen of her crew. The Thirlmere has arrived at Pernambuco with the survivors of the Johnson crew.

The Earthquake.

CONTOCOCK, N. H., November 12.—A shock of earthquake was felt about 7.50 a.m. in Hopkinton, Hillsborough, Bradford and Warner. It was particularly severe in the latter town, where things were generally shaken up.

LONDON, Ont., November 13.—A shock of earthquake was felt in Colchester and Kingsville, Essex County, Ont., this morning about 10 o'clock. In the former place it was quite severe, and greatly alarmed the people of the village. At Kingsville the glass in a few windows was broken.

CONTOCOCK, N. H., November 13.—A shock of earthquake was felt in the northern and western sections of this city last night.

The Patti Divorce.

PARIS, November 13.—The Patti divorce case, a decision in which was rendered yesterday, has excited much remark. Madame Patti first presented a petition for divorce from her husband, the Marquis de Caux; the Marquis hereupon presented a cross petition. The tribunal took cognizance of the husband's petition, and pronounced a divorce for his benefit. It refused absolutely to entertain Patti's petition, inasmuch as the scandal which caused the separation between the husband and wife was still maintained by the latter.

December and about September.

ST. LOUIS, November 13.—Maj. Gen. W. S. Harney was married this evening at the Cathedral to his former housekeeper, May St. Cyr. The groom is eighty-four and the bride forty-five years of age. Harney is the oldest general on the retired list and his marriage is creating a good deal of comment. He is very wealthy. The pair left for New Orleans.

Suicide.

TRENTON, N. J., November 13.—Rev. Henry Williamson, rector of St. Paul church, of this city, committed suicide this morning by shooting himself through the head, near the outskirts of the city. He used a new revolver and fired through the temple, dashing brains all over. He was found by two boys. No motive is known for the act. Deceased was a son of Ex-Chancellor Williamson, of Elizabeth.
