Winter Care of Sheep—Strawberries—Blindness at Birth—Cleanliness a Necessity—Etc., Etc.

Mr. C. A. Free, in the Fruit Grower says: "We shall never much benefit from strawberries with a new variety. Though a good winter protection, it can not be made free from ground and weed seeds, and to this respect soil made clean by log culture is vexatious."

A horse troubled with worms will become very thin, no matter how well fed. It will have a desire to rub his tail on everything possible, and dig a little at a time. To get rid of them, and improve the condition of the animal, prepare by giving a drachm dose of tartar emetic, morning and night, in bran mash, giving neither hay nor oats for three days.

Total, 191 pounds of food per week per horse.
