British Soldiers Start for the Battle Fields.

THE UNEMPLOYED OF LONDON.

The Oklahoma Bill—France and China—The Weather—Logan Ahead—Capital Chat—Dynamite.

Off For Egypt.

LONDON, February 18.—The Duke of Cambridge, to-day, inspected the guards as the latter were leaving for Suakin. The Duke, in an address to the guards, reminded them that their discipline was of a high order, and England would expect a good report of their services in the field.

Want Work.

LONDON, February 18.—Sir Vernon Harcourt, Home Secretary, to-day received a deputation of unemployed workmen, who disavowed any socialist tendency to ask government for relief for the unemployed of London.

The Oklahoma Bill.

WASHINGTON, February 18.—The bill reported to the Senate to enable the President to negotiate for the purchase of Oklahoma lands, provides, among other things, that any person who, without authority of law, enters these lands shall be fined not more than \$500 or imprisoned not more than one year, or both.

France and China.

LONDON, February 18.—A dispatch from Shanghai states that in the naval engagement between the French fleet of Admiral Courbet and five Chinese men-of-war, a French torpedo sunk two Chinese war ships, the others escaping in the fog.

The French residents at Shanghai have been placed under Russian protection.

The Russian flag is hoisted over the French concessions.

PARIS, February 18.—A dispatch from Admiral Courbet says: "We have attacked the Chinese squadron and gained a complete victory." Another dispatch says the French fleet succeeded in sinking two of the three Chinese men-of-war, which took refuge in Ningpo river on Saturday last.

Logan Ahead.

SPRINGFIELD, Ills., February 18.—The Legislature met in joint session at noon for the purpose of voting for United States Senator. Two hundred and two members were present, and two absent, one Democrat and one Republican. The first ballot resulted: Logan, 101, the full Republican strength present, Morrison, 81, E. M. Haines, 3, scattering 3. No election. Only one ballot was taken.

The Wabash.

NEW YORK, February 18.—Officials of the Wabash company say the proposition for the reorganization of the company proposed by Wm. Chamberlain, of the London bondholders committee, will be accepted by American investors, and it is probable within the next six months the plan will be carried through.

The Weather.

NEW YORK, February 18.—At the signal service office to-day, it was stated that the snowstorm was only local in its effects. Four inches was the depth reached in this city. At 11 a.m. the thermometer stood 14. The New York Central & Hudson River railroad refuse the sale of sleeping car berths to points west of Albany.

CHICAGO, February 18.—The weather here and throughout Illinois, Wisconsin, Iowa and Nebraska has greatly moderated. Freight and passenger trains started out on time this morning. A prominent railway official estimated the loss to all roads by the storms during the second and third weeks of this month at from \$2,000,000 to \$3,000,000.

The Fire Fiend.

CHEYENNE, Wyo., February 18.—The Daily Leader states that at 1 o'clock this afternoon a barn on the ranch of Hon. Harry Oelrichs, six miles from this city, was burned. The fire started from a stove in the harness room. The imported stallion "Brudant," costing \$15,000, also a Cleveland bay, valued at \$5,000, and three other horses and a number of carriages were burned. Loss, \$25,000.

Capital Chat.

WASHINGTON, February 18.—The Secretary of the Interior has declined to reinstate the land entry of John Talbot, in the Cheyenne district of Wyoming. Talbot's entry would, if allowed, place him in possession of land comprising the entire water supply of the city of Cheyenne.

The Dorsheimer Bill.

WASHINGTON, February 18.—Bland, chairman of the committee on coinage, weights and measures, says it is doubtful whether the Dorsheimer silver bill will receive any consideration by the committee, inasmuch as the House meets daily at 11 o'clock, and it will be impossible to get a quorum of the committee together.

Shut Down.

LYNCHBURG, Va., February 18.—Victoria iron mines and furnace, Rockbridge county, have shut down on account of overstock and 1,200 men are thrown out of employment.

Dynamite.

LONDON, February 18.—A canister filled with a substance supposed to be dynamite, and a partly burned fuse attached, were found to-day near the magistrates' room at Woolwich court.

A Severe Storm.

QUEBEC, February 18.—The blizzard continued with unabated fury till daylight, when a storm set in. All railroads are blocked.

A Strike.

PIRSSBURG, February 18.—Mansfield valley coal miners resolved not to abide by the umpire's decision and a strike will probably result.
