The Duties of American Soldiers.

MISS NEVADA'S SHREWDNESS.

Big Bank Failure—A Little Foreign Sensation—More Chicago Election Frauds—A Queenly Act.

Americans at the Isthmus.

WASHINGTON, April 9.—Captain Norton, commanding the Shenandoah, informs the navy department that he has landed about 150 men in Panama for the protection of American interests.

Secretary Whitney replied: "Your duty is confined to protecting the railway and steamship companies property and the lives and property of American citizens, and so far as your force permits keeps transit open."

Mr. Ferral, Costa Rican minister, today received the following cablegram from the President of Salvador: Santa Ana, April 9.—We confirm the complete victory at Chichnapa, the death of President Barrios and his son Don Venancio.

Secretary Whitney today received a dispatch from Commander Mahan, of the Wecheacha, dated La Libertad, Salvador, which says: "Barrios is certainly dead. The Nicaraguan troops entered Honduras, routing the enemy, who retreated in disorder to the mountains."

Bank Failure.

NEWARK, Va., April 9.—The Farmer's bank, this city, did not open at the usual hour today. Notice was posted on the door stating that the bank had made an assignment to Walter F. Irvine, for the benefit of creditors.

The liabilities of the Farmer's bank are almost a quarter of a million. Assets not stated. The cashier says he expects to pay in full. An assignment of all property of the bank is made in the interest of its creditors.

Nevada's Shrewdness.

CHICAGO, April 7.—The published statement is made that when Miss Nevada, the prima donna of Mapleson's company, first appeared in New York, she was to receive \$1,000 a night, but when she at first failed to secure a success, Mapleson reduced the figures to \$300.
