EVENTS AND COMMENTS.

A SUNKEN city, presumably Roman, has recently been discovered near Nantes, France. The theatre had a seating capacity for about 4,000 persons.

FIVE BARBERS were, on the 29th ult., fined by a police magistrate in Ottawa, Canada, for profanation of the Sabbath, by shaving customers on the Sunday previous. The magistrate said that "printers and telegraphers, unless working for the government, are liable to a similar penalty."

NOW THAT Crook is untrammled by other commanders it is to be hoped that he will do something to suppress the marauding Apaches. This is his last chance. If he fails this time, it is difficult to see how his defenders will be able to explain his lack of success on any other theory than incompetence.

PHILADELPHIA'S electric lights for street illumination displace gas lamps in the ratio of five electric lights to eleven gas lights. They might displace more gas lights, but this is the actual practice. The result is that electric lighting of the streets costs but twice as much as gas lighting, but the illumination is very much better.

THE DESTINATION of the Great Eastern, which was sold by auction to Messrs. De Matos, of London and Cardiff, is to be Gibraltar, to which port she will carry a cargo of South Wales coal. She will then serve the purpose of a coal hulk—that is to say, her cargo will be replenished as it becomes exhausted, and vessels will take in coal from her, she being permanently moored at Gibraltar.

THE MELODY of the sailors' chorus, "We sail the ocean blue, and our saucy ship's a beauty," in *Pinafore*, is declared by F. S. Saltus to have appeared originally as a buffo duet in *The Burgomaster Saardan*, written by Donizetti in 1827. Mr. Saltus says he has addressed a note to Sir Arthur, asking him if he had ever seen the score of Donizetti's work, but has received no reply.

WASHINGTON TERRITORY ladies have got things down to a finer point than their Montana sisters. The other day at Tampico, the postmaster beat his wife, whereupon the wives of the town gathered in force, tied the postmaster to a fence, and thrashed him until he fainted. This is intended more as a pointer to Montana women than a warning to Montana postmasters.

It is said that the nations of the earth speak about ninety different dialects. But these dialects can be traced to a much smaller number of languages. All these languages are divided into three classes—namely, the Indo-Germanic, which embraces the ancient classical languages and those of modern Europe; the Sanscrit, which embraces all the various languages of India, and the Semitic, which embraces the Hebrew, Chaldaic, Syriac, Arabic, etc.

THE WAGES of grave robbery in the case of Mrs. Eusebia Fitzgerald are two years in the penitentiary at Rochester, New York. The case was a flagrant one, and no doubt the lesson will be a good one for the adventurers who boldly violate all the rights of the dead as well as the living. Mrs. Fitzgerald's counsel has appealed her case, but there is small chance of a rehearing, as the evidence against her was clear and conclusive.

PAULINE HOWGATE is said to yearn to return to this country. It is strange the passion which all men who misappropriate money have for getting back to the place where they committed the crime. The Tweed conspirators who escaped to Europe were wretched in exile, and the major part of Eno's colony of forgers and embezzlers in Canada would gladly return across the border were they not in terror of the law. One would imagine that exile would be welcome to such men, and that forgetfulness would be their chief desire; but experience has shown that it is not so.

FROM St. Louis comes a curious story of the cure of insanity by cocaine, the new anodyne. It is difficult to see how the cure was effected with this drug, which, from all accounts, is as pernicious in its results to those who become accustomed to its use as chloral hydrate or opium. The recent case of the ruin of a physician's family in New York, shows clearly how terrible may be the effects of the drug if used in excess. Cocaine is a great aid in surgery, but it should not be prescribed freely by physicians any more than chloral hydrate, chloroform or morphine, as death itself is preferable to the slavery of these drugs when the habit is once firmly fixed upon the victim.
