A General Advance on the Stock List Yesterday.

New York Stock Market.

New York, September 8.—Government bonds dull and quotations for 4s are 1/4 higher. The stock market during the morning hours was one of the duller for many a day, and with the exception of a slight movement in New York and New England, was absolutely without a feature. The market opened about steady, the first prices showing slight changes only from the closing figure of yesterday although Delaware & Hudson was down 1/4 per cent. Business was unusually dull up to noon, but Western Union was moved up rapidly after 12 o'clock, St. Paul following, and there were also sharp advances in Missouri Pacific and St. Paul & Northwestern. The general market being firm to strong, and closing at about the best figures reached. The net result of the day's business was a general advance throughout the list, Missouri Pacific being up 1 1/2 per cent., but others for fractional amounts only.


