

He Takes a Yacht Trip to Potsdam.

THE NEW GOVERNOR-GENERAL

A Family War-In Honor of Grand Duke Alexis-General News Paragraphs.

The Sick Emperor.

Berlin, June 1.—Emperor Frederick had a good night. He left for Potsdam at 11 this morning on the steam yacht Alexandr-a. He was accompanied by the imperial family. The weather was showery and his majesty retired to the cabin as soon as he got on board, and remained there. The yacht was covered with flowers. There were enthusiastic crowds at the dock. A great crowd greeted the yacht on her arrival at Spandau. There was much cheering and bands played the national hymn. The Emperor appeared at the cabin window and bowed to the people, and the Empress waved her handkerchief from the deck. The yacht reached Potsdam at 12:40. His majesty was no worse for the trip.

The Princess of Saxe Meiningen and the Emperor's other daughters were in waiting at Glienicke landing stage to receive him. The Emperor ascended the steps without assistance. Accompanied by the Empress, he entered a closed carriage and was driven through Nauen to Castle Friedrichskron. Pupils of the Sans Souci schools lined the road. The Emperor looked very well and bowed repeatedly in response to the hearty acclamations with which he was greeted.

Canada's New Governor

LONDON, June 1.—On arrival at Ottawa, a reporter had an interview with Lord Stanley, new Governor-general of Canada. He said he had acquired while in the colonial office, considerable knowledge of Canada's vast resources, and been greatly impressed with the future in store for the country. He would not go to his new post with preconceived ideas and did not wish to force any policy upon the country possessing a responsible government. He was confident the Dominion ministers would cordially co-operate with him, should troublesome questions arise.

A Family War.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn., June 1.—A battle took place between the Jones and Green factions, in Hancock County, yesterday, which resulted in the death of two of the Green family. The feud began in January over a bad fence, and on February 13th, one of the Jones' family was shot by Dave Green. Since then the two families and their respective friends have been under arms and several battles have occurred.

WASHINGTON, June 1.—The Commissioner of the General Land Office has completed a tabulated statement, showing the total amount of land actually returned to the public domain and opened for entry and settlement, showing the total amount recommended by the land office for restoration still pending amounting to 1,541,058 acres.

In Honor of Grand Duke Alexis.

St. Petersburg, June 1.—To-day is the name-day of the Grand Duke Alexis and in his honor a new ironclad frigate was launched and the keel laid for a new Imperial yacht. The Queen of Greece and the Imperial family were present at the ceremonies. A squadron from Cronstadt which had receded here by the way of the new maritime canal, fired salutes.
