THE WORKERS IN THE EAST.

The Chicago Extension--Gen. Harrison and Utah Literature.

Mr. Geoghegan, of the advance guard sends the following to Mr. Lawrence, Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce and Citizens' Committee: It is dated Indianapolis, June 29th. "This afternoon I go to Torre Haute, Crawfordsville and Lafayette, and Mr. Sells takes another route into Chicago, thus covering the ground at little expense. Our experience in this town has been very satisfactory. In fact, I question after all, if our very best field is not in places of this kind, where the people have really no idea of our country, except as to some of our products. I would not be surprised if at least 100 people visit our city from this point, and other results are probable. The excursion party from Chicago, which I believe Mr. Sells mentioned to you, has assumed larger proportions, and on the 9th of July, at least three car loads of people will leave Chicago, en route for Salt Lake. One third of these are going to stay in Salt Lake for a month, and as they are the class of men who are city builders, I think it would be well for the Chamber of Commerce to show them every attention. Amongst them will be some prominent railroad men who wield a great deal of influence, and they have promised to do all in their power to further the Salt Lake movement. We are working on another scheme, which will be of great benefit if we can get it through, but as yet it is not in a shape that we could give you an intelligent idea of. We called on General Harrison yesterday, had a talk with him concerning Utah, and left him some of our literature."


