WHY IS IT?

One of the inexplicable things is the opposition manifested in the city council and in certain other quarters to the Salt Lake City Railroad company.

The HERALD is not the champion of the street railway company and has no interest in it, but we do like justice and fair play, and we think that meritorious performances should be recognized.

There is another and more serious thing which should have been taken into account and governed the council. If one hand can give a concert in a respectable theatre or hall on Sunday afternoon or evening and charge an admission fee, another hand can give a concert on Sunday in a beer garden or hall that is not respectable.

It will grieve the better classes of Salt Lake citizens, without regard to their religious belief, to think that the charming characteristic of the city, the quiet and peaceful Sabbath, is to be taken away, and for no better reason than to put money into the pockets of a few men who beat drums in a political campaign.

It seems to us that if the city council were as familiar with the facts as it should be, there would be no more of the emphy which shows itself so plainly, and there would be no more of the disposition to "cinch" the company which one cannot fail to observe.
