It is fair to General RAY to say that he denies the charges in an interview with a Washington reporter. He says he is ready for an investigation and that he can show that his administration of the pension bureau has been honest and devoid of favoritism. It seems to us that he ought not to stop at a denial and an announcement of readiness to be investigated; but should compel his accuser to take the consequences of publishing a malicious libel. The really guilty man can deny.

On the whole, the bill is a good one, if Congress had the right to pass it; not having the right, we regard the measure as exceedingly mischievous, more threatening to American rights and interests than any similar law now applies to these places in which the United States have exclusive jurisdiction, and the introduction of the bill, followed as it will be by its rejection, may inspire the state to afford the protection against foreign landholders which the judiciary committee desires to afford.

WHEN THE THOMAS-EDWARDS bill shall have become law there will be just one party in Utah, and it will be composed of six members of the legislature.

THE LIBERALS should at once concentrate their efforts to support the bill, and thus avoid the trouble and expense of maintaining an organization and conducting campaigns.
