A Challenge to Kiesel.
Hon. David Evans, Democratic candidate for the council from the Second district, has sent the following challenge to Fred J. Kiesel, the Liberal candidate for the same office:

OGDEN, July 25, 1891.
Hon. F. J. Kiesel, Ogden, Utah.
My Dear Sir:—I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your communication, as a candidate for the office of councilor of the legislative assembly of Utah, in the election to be held on the 25th inst. I am informed by the public press, you were nominated by the Liberal party for the same office. In order that a friendly discussion may be properly presented to the people, and the issues which divide us be understood by them, I hereby challenge you to a friendly discussion before the people of Ogden, the details of which to be arranged by the central committee of both parties. The time may be divided between us, according to arrangements which may be conducted by some referee selected by the respective committees. I desire to begin as soon as practicable and to continue until the campaign is ended. With great respect I am, very truly,

Mr. Kiesel replied to the communication as follows:

Hon. D. Evans:
Yours of July 24th inviting me to a joint discussion, etc., has just been received. In reply I have only to say that I place myself in the hands of the central committee of the Liberal party, who have the conduct of the Liberal campaign in hand, and hold myself in readiness to meet you on the rostrum of a hall, in their discretion, or where you may direct. According to Mr. Kiesel's reply he seems anxious to confront Mr. Evans for a discussion on the issue that involves the campaign. It is understood, however, that the Liberal committee do not deem it advisable, and therefore will not permit their candidate and Mr. Evans to come to Ogden. They believe that it would not be to their interests to have him exposed in public.

How Yesterday Was Observed.
Ogden had the appearance of Sunday more than anything yesterday. The stores were closed as was almost every other place of business. Although there was no special place of amusement within the city, the people observed the anniversary of the coming of the pioneers to Utah by separating from their every-day walks and gathering at the different resorts and other places of amusement that surround the city.

Syracuse, Ogden's popular lake resort, drew the largest crowd during the day than any other place. In the morning the excursion of Canton Ogden No. 3, P. M. I. O. O. F. The Old Fellows' lodges went out in a body from this city and during the day the lodges from Salt Lake, Park City and other places joined them there.

The special attractions for the day were bathing, boating, racing and dancing. The Japanese troupe, which entertained the crowds at Garfield Beach for a week, were there about as many Salt Lake as Ogden people at the place.

In the afternoon Kent's Military band repaired to the Hot Springs, where they gave a grand ball. Owing to the extreme heat not an overly large crowd was there until the evening, when it is safe to say there was a pavilion full.

The citizens of Five Points picnicked at Shermer's grove, about one-half mile west of that popular suburb.

Regardless of the heated rays of the sun, which poured down upon the burning sands at the Junction City Driving park, a large crowd was there to witness the races between some of the best horses of Ogden, Salt Lake and Logan.

A large number filled their dinner baskets with plenty of eatables and sought the shades of the cañons and other mountain resorts.

North Ogden celebrated in a most commendable manner.

In Lester park a game of ball was played between two picked nines, the "Stars" and "Hallelujahs." A spirited message was played, and at the end of the ninth inning the score stood 15 to 16 in favor of the "Stars."
