

GUILTY OF CONTEMPT.

OGDEN, Jan. 31.—Judge Miner this afternoon handed down his decision in the contempt of court cases which have grown out of the breaking up of the South Ogden Mercantile company.

Solomon C. Stephens and William J. Stephens were each fined \$5 for the first offense and \$50 for the second. In default of payment they will serve one day in jail for each dollar unpaid.
