

TOO MANY COMMISSIONERS

The Ogden Bar Wants the Number Decreased to Two.

PROJECTED MANUFACTORY.

Two Boys Who Escaped from the Reform School Recaptured.

The Utah Loan and Trust Company Officially Indignant at a Malicious Story Circulated by a Liberal Official—Ogden Notings.

Ogden, May 1.—[Special.]—Ogden's Bar association, at its annual meeting today, decided to work for a decided decrease in the number of supreme court commissioners in this city and also to investigate charges of unprofessional and dishonorable practices preferred against Ely H. Jones and Brigham H. Jones—brothers, some relation—presenting attorneys of Brigham City and members of this bar. The latter was present when the charges were sprung and denied them in toto, asserting that the only reason they had been made was on account of the personal dislikes of a few of the members of the bar. It was stated that the Joneses have been guilty of a multiplicity of dishonest and even criminal acts in the matter of witnesses and affidavits. The following resolution was passed:

Resolved, That the ends of justice will be served by limiting the number of commissioners of the supreme court in Ogden to two who shall have the endorsement of this association;

Resolved, That the foregoing resolution be laid before the supreme court and that body be petitioned to carry it out.

There are now seven commissioners in Ogden and six justices of the peace.

The following officers were elected for the coming year: Hamilton Smith, president; J. S. Boreman, first vice-president; M. A. Brodeen, second vice-president; B. C. Mosby, secretary; Frank S. Schooner, treasurer. The association is in an extremely prosperous condition.

Tomorrow night, the Business Men's association will meet and discuss the proposition to establish a wool working plant for the manufacture of shawls and shawls after the Garff patent.

Michael Drodowicz, a Polish Jew, doing business as a clothier, on Twenty-fourth street, today made an assignment in favor of H. C. Wardleigh. Certain business misfortunes and difficulties are attributed as the cause. The preferred creditors are David Brothers, of New York, \$460, 74; Mary Drodowicz, Ogden, \$500; J. Lewenstein, Valparaiso, Ind., \$1,198.75. There are a number of smaller creditors.

The goods contained in the store will be sold and the proceeds may be sufficient to pay the liabilities.

Superintendent Allison of the reform school today received information that two of the three boys who escaped from the reform school, on April 23, were in Butte, and telegraphed the marshal to apprehend them. This evening he received a dispatch stating that Thomas Blundell, aged 16, of Salt Lake had been captured, and the officers expressed a belief that he would have the other, Robert Hill, also of Salt Lake, in the morning. The superintendent is of the opinion that Charles Wooten, aged 14, of Ogden, is also in Butte, as they all fled together.

The boys escaped by making ropes of the blankets which were on their beds, and letting themselves out of a second-story window.

Charles Miller, who was arrested on Sunday, charged with obtaining goods under false pretences, had a hearing before Justice Cahoon today, and was acquitted for lack of criminalizing evidence. It seems that Miller got in with three Germans, and, according to their story, represented himself as an engineer in the employ of the Utah Pacific. The designers were anxious to get to Walla Walla, Wash., and Miller offered to get them each 500 miles of transportation for \$15. He had the "traps" to show his authority and displayed to the Germans, documents bearing a great profusion of seals and signatures. One of the men bit and having no money, gave him his watch. The timepiece and Miller vanished simultaneously, and no ticket was forthcoming. The professed engineer was found by an officer near the railroad stockyards.

The board of directors of the board of trade met this afternoon in executive session and considered several propositions which have been submitted. Among them that of stockyards. A plan is being formulated whereby the necessary \$20,000 cash bonuses can be raised. The board will soon make permanent headquarters in the three rooms of the city hall formerly occupied by the chamber of commerce and begin the collection of an exhibit of Utah products, including mines and manufactures.

An adroit Liberal city official is said to have adroitly whispered, into the ears which would most angle, that their owner had repeated the information, that none but Mormon workmen need apply for employment on the reconstruction of the Utah Loan and Trust company building and that such applicants for work must show his recommendation. The officers of the company naturally feel very indignant and today stated to a HERALD representative that more than two-thirds of the men engaged on the building are non-Mormons. No discriminations whatever have been practiced.

Oscar Dunn of Millville, Cache county, was arrested on Saturday by Deputy Corey, charged with adultery and taken before Commissioner Fletcher of Logan and released in bonds of \$1,000. His alleged plural wife Jane A. Welch, was also arrested and held in bonds of \$500 as a witness.

The May term of the Fourth district court commenced today, and all unfinished business was continued to the next term. The following grand jury was impaneled and charged: Samuel Hall, Hyrum Hoyball, Willis Johnson, John C. Gray, Robert Kewley, George H. Burcitt, John Kennedy, Jr., John Bradley, Charles Denn, Jr., John Trappett, Joseph M. Davis, Stuart, Frank Hyland, Charles Aelmer and Adam Larsen. The judge's charge contained no special fea-

tures and was simply the old story. The jury has but few cases to investigate.

The charges of conspiracy against the union printers who worked against the defendant Post last fall, were dismissed, as were also those of prize-fighting against James Williams, George Morrison and Paul Gillispie, three of those interested in the Williams-Turner mill.

Frank W. Sherwood has commenced suit for divorce against his wife, Martha J. Sherwood, and alleges in his complaint that the woman has deserted him and become a common prostitute. He also affirms that she has on several occasions tried to kill herself and on Saturday last armed herself with a revolver and attempted to kill him. One child has been the result of the union, which was consummated in January, 1884, at Hebern, Penn.

City Council.

At a meeting of the city council tonight Mayor Lundy vetoed the resolution allowing councilmen \$4 a day for committee work and the objections were sustained. The mayor also sent in a veto of the resolution granting an officer \$40 a month while representing Ogden on the police department of the World's fair.

This raised a storm of debate, during the course of which many personalities were indulged in. It finally came to a vote and the mayor was again sustained. According to the opinion of the city attorney the officer who is now in Chicago will draw his full pay of \$30 per month. President Resall gave notice that he would at the next meeting introduce a resolution reducing salaries of city officials.

The ordinance granting an extension of twenty-five years on the franchise of the Salt Lake and Ogden Gas and Electric company was read a second time, but on motion to have it read a third time and passed failed. Improvements in the company's plant here, costing fully \$125,000, depend upon the passage of this ordinance.


