

BRITISH DEFEAT IN SOUTH AFRICA.

Two Columns Reported Annihilated by King Lobengula.

PREPARING FOR THE NAVAL CONTEST.

Brazilians Anticipating the Meeting of Peixoto and Mello's Ships.

Rio the Scene of Activity—Taking Positions to Witness the Fight—Peixoto Retains the Portuguese Minister—Rioting in Germany—British Anarchists Threaten the Queen Regent and Infants.

London, Dec. 27.—Several South African merchants in this city have received cable messages today announcing that Captain Wilcox's scouting party which had been pursuing King Lobengula and which had not been heard from for some time, has been completely annihilated by the Matabeles.

It is stated now that in addition to Wilson's party, a party under Captain Barrow set out to reinforce him and has been cut to pieces. No press dispatches have been received which either confirm or contradict these reports. The number composing the Wilson detachment is said to have been 40 to 100 and the Barrow detachment is supposed to have consisted of about the same number. The news caused great excitement in this city and is being magnified on all sides. The rumors have it that the two columns were in a pitched battle for several hours and after being completely surrounded by the Matabeles were charged upon repeatedly and slaughtered to a man, the bodies being horribly mutilated.

IN BRAZILIAN WATERS.

Admiral Mello Preparing to Meet the Enemy.

Pernambuco, Dec. 27.—[Copyrighted by Associated Press.] The greatest mystery surrounds the movements of Rear Admiral Mello. Nothing has been seen of him since he sailed north on the 20th, presumably to show fight to the new government cruisers, Nictheroy and Bahia.

Word has been received of trouble between Brazil and Portugal, because by order of President Peixoto the Portuguese minister is detained against his will. It is stated that the minister tried to leave despite the president's orders, and that force was employed to detain him.

Later in the day, great excitement was caused by the news that Admiral Mello had arrived at Bahia, and the men on board the Nictheroy began with hearty good wishes in readiness to meet the enemy.

The rebel warship was reported as sailing at Bahia preparatory to starting for Pernambuco to capture or destroy the Nictheroy, after which, if successful, she will give the America a drubbing.

Mello is expected here tomorrow. It is not expected that he will attack in broad daylight.

It is now said the Nictheroy will steam out to meet him.

St. Louis, Dec. 27.—Republic New Orleans special; Tilman Green, a colored coachman of a family at Columbia, attempted to outrage his mistress while her husband was absent. He broke into her room at night, but she escaped and gave an alarm. He confessed his intention and was lynched, a number of negroes participating.

An Embuizer Re-arrested. New York, Dec. 27.—Joseph H. Lewis, whose defalcations as bookkeeper caused the failure of A. J. Schloss & Co., and who recently attempted suicide in the Union Park hotel, has been re-arrested on the charge of grand larceny. The shortage already discovered is \$70,000, and it is believed his embezzlement will reach \$200,000 to \$300,000. The day before the assignment of Schloss & Co. they thought they were rich men.

Nelson Monument Culprits. Montreal, Dec. 27.—A petition is being circulated and signed among the English residents of Montreal asking the discharge of the young men, Merclia, Pelland and Demary, charged with attempting to blow up the Nelson monument on the night of Nov. 19. The further preliminary hearing of the case is fixed for Jan. 15. It is deemed likely the boys will be committed to stand trial at the court of Queen's Bench.

Train Robbers Outwitted. Paris, Dec. 27.—An attempt was made to hold up the south-bound Erico train at West Fork, Ark., last night. Several desperate characters were there, but a telegram notified the officials and they were on hand to guard on the train at Fayetteville, who conducted the train to Fort Smith and then escorted the north-bound train through the threatened point.

Denver's Ex-Treasurer. Denver, Dec. 27.—James P. Hadley, ex-city treasurer recently brought back from California to answer charges of forgery, will probably go free. All the forged checks were nullified and the charge of embezzlement dismissed. The only remaining charge is misdemeanor and that will probably be dropped.

Conhills' Case. Chicago, Dec. 27.—In the Coughlan case today a number of witnesses testified as to the character of the wounds on Dr. Cronin's body and as to the condition of the Carlson cottage, in which the murder was committed, but developing nothing new.

In the afternoon the prosecution met its first repulse. Judge Tenthredin refused to admit testimony upon "the conspiracy in camp 20."

Three Attempts at Suicide. New York, Dec. 27.—Louis Becker, a shirt manufacturer, Max Simon, a carpenter, and Charles Harrison, a clerk, attempted suicide this morning. They are destitute and unemployed and sought death as a relief from their sufferings. All will recover.

Tramp Hold-Ups Captured. Ottumwa, Ia., Dec. 27.—Three tramps in broad daylight held up six men, robbed a boy and robbed and beat a farmer. They were captured by the police.

The Prendergast Trial. Chicago, Dec. 27.—In the Prendergast case the attorneys for the defense presented arguments in favor of the insanity theory.

Harvy Loss by Fire. Port Jarvis, N. Y., Dec. 27.—The entire upper end of the Narrowsburg, including two hotels, three stores, a mill and dwelling, was burned; the loss was heavy, with light insurance.

One Man Perished. Providence, Dec. 27.—The new Molten block was gutted by fire tonight. One man perished. Loss \$200,000.

RESULTS OF DEPRESSION. Eastern Business Failures—Receivers Take Possession. Philadelphia, Dec. 27.—Samuel Hellner, a coal merchant, made an assignment today. The failure was precipitated by the slump in New York. New England stock, of which he was a heavy holder, having gone in a pool with several other Philadelphia capitalists, which purchased sufficient stock to secure control of the road for McLeod. Hellner says his mercantile affairs were in excellent shape and there would have been no trouble but for the drop in New England. "I was a director for New York & New England," said Hellner, "I stood by the pool and by my stock, and when it went down I simply could not stand the squeeze." It is a well known fact that Hellner had the most implicit faith in McLeod, and this caused him to take such heavy investments in New England. It is said he had invested about \$25,000 in the stock because of this confidence. He has many friends among the leading capitalists of this city and all believe he will pay every dollar of indebtedness and recoup his lost fortune. No statement is yet made of his assets and liabilities.

GOVERNOR LEWELLING'S PLAN.

Would Discharge Single Men to Employ the Married.

Tom Platt Appointed Receiver for the New England.

COMPLETE SURPRISE TO THE OFFICERS.

Northern Pacific Employees Will Appeal to the Courts.

They Claim to be Interested Parties and Their Side Should be Heard—New York & New England's President Threatens an Attempt to Oust Receiver Platt—Western Roads Will Divide Emigrant Traffic.

Albany, N. Y., Dec. 27.—Boardman of the law firm of Tracy, Boardman & Platt, appeared before Judge Wallace of the United States court this morning and asked that a temporary receiver be appointed for the New York & New England railroad. The court granted the request, and appointed Hon. T. C. Platt, one of the directors of the road. It is understood he is of the party opposed to President McLeod, who is also president and receiver of the Reading road. It is supposed he is selected for similar action with reference to the New England road, and that in the appointment of Platt he was outwitted. Frederick H. Prince, of Boston, is one of the leading spirits in opposition to McLeod. The application for the receiver was based on the alleged mismanagement of the road and its insolvency. The receiver should not be appointed was made, returnable January 10.

The Officers Surprised. New York, Dec. 27.—The temporary receivership for the New York & New England was decided on last night. One of the directors said: "There will be a lively fight if McLeod does not put up money for the January interest. Both sides are prepared for almost any emergency and in such an event it will be simply a matter of who gets there first. If McLeod raises the interest money there will be no receiver. If not there will. His action depends on the receipt of the stock. The McLeod party will not put up the money unless it can control the road, whether or not he can do so is an open question. The view of the New England road for the past five or six years has been that it had no working capital. The president always had to provide for all deficiencies. If he receives some of the stock he will not unfriendly, but was merely taken to conserve the interests of the security holders and creditors. Of course the receiver will be a surprise to the officers of the road.

McLeod, when seen, expressed great indignation at the move, and declared that he had known the move and had not taken place. He declared it very unfriendly to him but declined to talk further till he had seen the papers.

The move does not affect the Reading road, McLeod's connection with the latter having ceased when he was removed from the receivership of the Reading road some time ago.

The appointment caused virtually no surprise. It is well known that definite steps looking to such a result had been taken some time ago. A conference was held at the Fifth Avenue hotel and at a late hour the determination was reached to ask for a receiver. The conferees were Thomas C. Platt and E. H. Prince, directors of the New England company, and the Boardman and Frank H. Platt of the law firm of Tracy, Platt & Boardman, and some capitalists interested in the securities of the company. Boardman left for Albany on the midnight train to make application for the appointment of a receiver. One of the capitalists who attended the conference said a conference was held a little while before the committee appointed some time ago to raise the money required to pay the interest due January 1; \$200,000 will be required for the purpose, and the committee has been unable to secure it. Responses to the application of the committee have been very slow. Under the circumstances it was necessary that application be made for a receiver. It did not follow, however, that the application would be inimical to the interests represented by McLeod, although it was not believed that McLeod now held more stock than necessary to qualify him as a director and president of the company.

A meeting of the stockholders of the New England was held this afternoon at the office of the law firm of Boardman, New York, New England & Northern railroad. McLeod was present and made a statement explaining what had been done since his connection with the road as president. He alluded to the question of the lease which will be continued tomorrow, when it is expected sufficient votes will be received to ratify the lease. The question was going on today, the announcement was made that Platt had been appointed receiver.

McLeod said the application for a receiver was inimical to him. "We shall see, however," said he, "whether the road continues in the possession of the receiver. I was elected president last March and found an empty treasury, and unpaid vouchers, and many pressing creditors. The next day after the election an attachment was placed on a large portion of the rolling stock. Several members of the board and myself promptly came to the relief of the company and the attachment was removed and sufficient funds provided for pressing claims. Again advances were made for July interest. In the face of more rigid economy we have fallen off, owing to the general business depression. Under normal conditions the road is simply able to sustain itself."

McLeod advocated the ratification of the lease of the Norwich & Worcester, which includes the control of the Norwich and New York line of steamers. The New England company's indebtedness amounts to \$18,737,312, including bonds, mortgage notes and contract liabilities, also the floating debt of \$550,000 and twenty millions of common stock. In his address at the stockholders' meeting today, McLeod said: "I say to you emphatically I have never been a struggling receiver. I am a director of your company in any way except with the expectation of enhancing the intrinsic value and thus indirectly the credit of your company. I believe in the property, as I always have, and if this unfortunate year for all railroad companies had not overtaken us at a time when we were struggling to establish our credit and put the road and rolling stock in condition to transact

WITH THE SPORTS.

No Racing at Ivy City Pending a Decision.

Washington, Dec. 27.—The managers of the race meeting at the Ivy City track reluctantly decided late this afternoon to abandon all racing until January 4, when a decision is hoped for on the motion to quash the indictment of the bookmakers, to be heard by the grand jury this morning. The bookmakers will remain in Washington, but the bookmakers will go to New York and elsewhere. Should the indictment be quashed, as the race people expect, the bookies will return and the racing be resumed. If, however, the decision sustains the indictment, the race people will abandon the Ivy City track and start in business elsewhere. This conclusion was reached as a result of the proceedings in court today. As soon as Bookmaker Bennington and his three clerks were re-arrested today on indictments by the grand jury, the attorney before Justice Bradley, of the supreme court of the District of Columbia, criminal branch, who held them to bail in \$1,000.
