VOTERS, REGISTER. Voters--The house to house canvass of the registration officers will close on or before the 23d of September. The revision week commences September 24th, and closes October 1st. The books must be filed with the county clerk on or before October 8th, and all transfers of registered voters from one precinct to another in the same county must be made before the last named date.

Voters--A double registration is required for the election November 6th, 1894, a revision and entirely new registration. All qualified to vote for county and territorial officers, if not already on the lists, must take the usual oath and be duly entered. All qualified electors who desire to vote for delegates to the constitutional convention must take the new oath. No registrar can enter a name on the new list without this.

Voters--all the machinery of the election will be conducted in double form--there will be two sets of registration books--one in blue for the old revised list, one in blue for the new list. There will be two sets of ballot boxes for each polling place, one for the general election, and one for the new list. Also there will be two kinds of ballot envelopes, one in blue for the general election, one in blue for the convention delegates.
