

COPPER PLANT SUITS.

Two More Filed in the District Court Yesterday.

THREE DIVORCE SUITS.

MRS. SPEED, MRS. YOUNG AND MRS. CHRISTENSEN WANT RELIEF.

Creditors Object to Trustee Knox's Statement-William Ditchfield Exonerated from a Charge of Obtaining Goods by False Pretenses-Salt Lake County Sued-Miscellaneous Matters.

Charles B. Kimball has filed a complaint in intervention in the suit of Edward T. Singer vs. the Salt Lake Copper Manufacturing company and W. S. McCormick & Co., alleging that on March 27, 1895, he obtained judgment against the Copper company for \$5,343.31, which remains unsatisfied.

The intervenor says that in executing the first deed of trust and keeping the same from the record the Copper company held out false inducements for credit and thereby perpetrated a fraud on the intervenor and other in-

be adjudged a first lien on the copper plant property and that the same be sold under the unrecorded deed.

THREE DIVORCE SUITS.

Mrs. Ingoborg Speed Wants a Divorce and \$1,500 Alimony. Mrs. Ingoborg Speed has commenced proceedings for divorce from William Speed and in her complaint alleges that the marriage took place in this city on December 17, 1892, and that the defendant has failed and neglected to provide her with the common necessities of life, although quite able to do so, and that she has been obliged to do washing for a living. She also alleges that during the month of April last on various occasions defendant ordered her to leave her home and she was compelled to go and seek another home, and that at various times he came to her new residence and called her the vilest names and accused her of being unchaste and untrue to her marriage vows. She states that her husband is possessed of property to the amount of \$8,500 and prays for a decree of divorce and for \$1,500 alimony and \$150 attorney's fees. H. A. Smith and C. N. Nielsen are the plaintiff's attorneys.

This One Failed to Provide. Louisa C. Young is suing for a divorce from Erving V. Young. The plaintiff alleges that the marriage took place in this city on May 13, 1891, and that for more than a year the defendant has failed to provide her with the common necessities of life, although amply able to do so, and has compelled plaintiff to live upon the charity of her friends and upon her own earnings.

Mrs. Christensen Would Be Free. Mary Christensen, by her attorneys, Messrs. H. A. Smith and C. N. Nielsen, has entered suit for divorce against P. W. Christensen, alleging that the marriage took place on June 1, 1887, at St. George, this territory, and that on November 15, 1892, the defendant deserted her and their four children without cause or excuse, and since then has failed to provide her with the common necessities of life. She asks for a decree of divorce, \$15 a month alimony, \$75 attorney's fees and the custody of the four minor children.

CREDITORS OBJECT.

Not Satisfied with the Statement Filed by Knox. Attorneys P. B. Stephens, Benner X. Smith, Jones & Schroeder and Loofbourrow & Kahn, on behalf of a number of the creditors of the firm of Benjamin Davis, have filed in the Third district court objections to the report of Trustee George A. Knox, as filed in court by him. The objections are that the stock taken possession of by George A. Knox, as trustee, amounted to \$25,000 at wholesale price with freight added, and it is alleged that during the period Mr. Knox acted as trustee he purchased real goods in violation of his duty as trustee with the moneys realized from sales, and that he did not pay the necessary attention to his duties as trustee, but allowed the mortgagor, Benjamin Davis, to run the business. Objection is also made to the amount paid Davis (\$120 per month) for attending to the business, as excessive, and it is stated that \$75 a month would have been ample, and that any payment of the amount of Davis was detrimental to the interest of the creditors. Objection is also taken to the amount of remuneration retained by the trustee. It then goes on to state that the stock turned over by Trustee Knox to Receiver amounts to only about \$10,000, and a full and complete accounting is prayed for.

Recent creditors, and that as to him and them the said deed is null and void and should be held of no effect. That the subsequent deed of trust to Hanauer was illegally issued and was not the act of the Copper company, and was an attempt by certain stockholders to take undue advantage of this intervenor and other innocent creditors to the profit and benefit of said stockholders, and said deed is, as to this intervenor and such creditors, null and void. Therefore the intervenor asks that his claim be declared a first lien upon the property of the Copper company and that in case of sale of the property the intervenor's claim be ordered first paid.

SINGER AMENDS.

Xerox He Holds Is Now Overdue-Wants It Paid. E. T. Singer has filed in the Third district court an amended and supplemental complaint in the suit of E. T. Singer vs. the Salt Lake Copper Manufacturing company, W. S. McCormick, A. Hanauer and many others. The complaint goes over much of the old ground, recites how Singer advanced \$25,000 and his friends \$75,000 more to the Copper company on notes secured by the unrecorded trust deed, which it is alleged is valid. The trust deed held by Hanauer for McCormick and his associates is then attacked as unauthorized and not the act of the Copper company. It is then stated that \$500,000 has been expended in putting in machinery and erecting buildings, and that same is now not worth over \$200,000; that the company is in such a position that it cannot protect itself against the claim for \$75,000 made by McCormick under the Hanauer trust deed; that small, if any, damage will result to the plant by a postponement of the sale until the rights of the parties are determined, while great damage would be done the plaintiff and he would lose his claim of \$25,000 if the sale is effected in the interest of the parties to the Hanauer trust deed. It is alleged that May, Saks and Shoensberg could not and would respond in damages to this plaintiff. The plaintiff alleges that the note he holds for \$25,000 was due on June 1, 1894, and being unpaid, under its terms he is entitled to sell the property to satisfy it. Plaintiff prays that the recorded deed be declared void and his claim

THAT COURT HOUSE DEAL.

It looks as though Weber county is going to have a small edition of the Salt Lake county court tactics, and there seems to be no legal way of preventing the scheme from being worked. For some time, it has been very apparent that the county would require a new court house room, and it was the general opinion that the proper place for a court house was on the city hall square. The land could be had there for nothing because it is to the interest of the city to encourage such improvements as a modern court house building would be to this square, and then again the city pays four-fifths of the taxes and it would be a matter of economy to donate the land for the court house and leave the present county building and grounds free to be sold and used as a matter of sound business judgment rigid economy was to be practiced. This was what conservative men thought about it but it was not considered necessary to do any thing in the way of building just now, in fact it seems to be the universal opinion that it would be possible to get along for at least two years without doing any thing, because times are hard and staidhood with increased general expenses to be borne by the county will soon be upon us and as a matter of sound business judgment rigid economy was to be practiced. The counties have to provide a place for holding the district court and the county court, and in a way fitted for that purpose, but to get over this difficulty it would be possible to rent temporary quarters at a very low rental per year that would answer every purpose. The United States government pays \$2,000 per year for the present court room and offices and that is all right but when that expense comes out of the pockets of the tax payers of this county cheerier quarters will do very well and it would have been possible to have secured a very convenient court room for \$750 per year. Instead of being governed by the general wish of the people, the county has decided to expend \$15,000 in the erection of an annex to the present county building which at best will be only a make shift and an actual waste of that much public money, because it will not provide what extra room the county business will require for three years and then it will be absolutely necessary to erect a new building. The interest on the money expended on this annex at 5 per cent, per annum would more than pay the rent of a temporary court room where the accommodations would be better than this annex would provide. It is generally thought that the majority of the members of the court were actuated more by selfish motives than a desire to serve the public, when they decided to build this annex. It is understood that members of the court have been supplying the county with material for different purposes and this building considerable more stuff will be furnished by members of the court. This is positively against the law and will certainly be ventilated, also several other little matters which have leaked out.

Salt Lake County Sued. M. C. Moon is suing Salt Lake county to recover \$53.35 on a claim assigned to the plaintiff by F. A. Simonds. It appeared that Simonds had assigned his claim to the Barnes, Hardy company and later assigned the same claim to the plaintiff. The Barnes, Hardy company filed the deed conveying it to them with the county clerk and collected on it. Moon filed his deed with the county clerk first and claims that he is entitled to the money by priority of filing. The case will be argued today before United States Commissioner Jennings on an agreed statement of facts.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES.

W. J. Robinson is suing Solomon Anderson in the Third district court to collect \$253.75 alleged to be due on an assigned judgment rendered in the Third district court on August 29, yesterday before United States Commissioner Sommer on a charge of obtaining from Walter J. Warren two kils and one chest of tools valued at \$150, by false pretenses. Attorney H. A. Smith appeared to prosecute and Attorney John M. Zane defended the accused. The evidence disclosed the fact that the tools were given to Ditchfield in security for the payment of a note which Ditchfield had endorsed and subsequently had to pay. It further appeared that the tools were left in charge of a man named Lewis, that Lewis' house was burnt and the tools along with it. There appeared to be nothing to support the charge against Ditchfield and he was discharged.
