

HOBART'S LEADER OF ACCEPTANCE How Free Silver Would Forever Do Up the Poor Man. WOULD CUT DOWN WAGES BRYAN'S ELECTION MEANS EVERYTHING THAT IS BAD.

Perpetuation of the Present Gold Standard the Only Hope for Both Rich and Poor of America—A Fifty-cent Free Dollar—Free and Unrestricted Coinage Would Put America on a Par with Mexico and China—Democratic Platform is Partial and One-Sided.

PATERSON, N. J., Sept. 9.—Following is the letter of acceptance of Garrett A. Hobart: Hon. Charles W. Fairbanks and Others of the Notification Committee of the Republican National Committee: Gentlemen—

THE GOLD STANDARD The platform declarations in reference to the money question express clearly and unmistakably the attitude of the Republican party as to this supremely important subject. We stand unflinchingly for HONESTY IN FINANCE and the permanent adjustment of our monetary system in the multifarious activities of trade and commerce to the gold standard.

ULTIMATE REDEMPTION With silver at its present price of less than fifty cents for every dollar of the market, such a policy means an immediate profit to the seller of silver for which he is to receive only one dollar for every two dollars of stamped coin will be given in exchange.

OUR COUNTRY'S FOREIGN TRADE and its production of iron, coal and other minerals has increased in the past few years to such an extent that we are now a net exporter of raw materials.
