NOBILITY VISITS ZION

Prince Hilkoft Lends His August Presence for an Hour. OF THE RUSSIAN MINISTRY ACCOMPANIED BY HIS SON AND A MILITARY OFFICER.

Minister of Ways and Communications--The Hon. Inspecting the Siberian Railroad and the Route of the Line Projected--An Odd Looking Individual But a Great Rail-roader--Is a Practical Engineer and Learned His Business in America--Being Shown Great Attention by American Railroad Men--His Trip Through Siberia.

Prince Michel Hilkoft, imperial minister of ways and communications of Russia, spent an hour in Salt Lake yesterday afternoon. The prince was accompanied by his son, Prince M. Hilkoft, an attaché of the Russian ministry of finance, and Gregoire Tschertkoff, lieutenant of the chevalier guards of her imperial majesty, Empress Maria Feodorovna, temporarily attached to Prince Hilkoft as secretary because of his complete mastery of English, and M. Bolchakoff, secretary and permanent attaché to the prince. Accompanying the party as pilot was Major J. G. Pangborn, a representative of the Field Columbian museum.

The imperial party arrived at Ogden yesterday afternoon by the Southern Pacific's special train, and were accompanied to the Junction City by General M. K. Schmitt, and Superintendent of Ways Curtis of the Southern Pacific company. At Ogden the party was turned over to the official of the Rio Grande, and the Denver & Rio Grande, who brought the distinguished personages to Salt Lake by special train made up of Les Daily's, the private car of Prince Hilkoft, and the private car of the General Manager D. C. Dodge's car A. E. Welby's car B. of the Western, and Assistant General Manager H. J. Schick's car A. of the D. & R. G. The party of officials of the two roads which went to Ogden to meet the imperial party was composed of General M. K. Schmitt, D. & R. G., Vice-President and General Manager D. C. Dodge of the Western, Assistant General Manager C. H. Schlack of the Denver & Rio Grande, Superintendent of motive power and machinery of the D. & R. G., who came in from Denver the evening before. The local officials of the party were Traffic Manager S. H. Balbeck and Superintendent A. E. Welby of the Western.

But little time was spent in Ogden, the prince preferring to spend such time as they had to spare, in Salt Lake. The run from Ogden was made in forty-two minutes, and arrived here at 10:30. The prince and his party were in waiting, and went for a drive about the city. The drive was made in the direction of Traffic Manager Balbeck of the Western, who had been laid out for the rest of his journey across the continent, the principal feature of which will be the sending of the Pennsylvania official train to Kansas City to meet the party and take them east.

The party's entertainment by American railway officials was arranged by Major Pangborn, who was the principal of the Baltimore & Ohio's great exhibit for the World's fair, and who met Prince Hilkoft while abroad in the interest of the Field museum.
