Judge Cherry Holds Court at Tooele.

GRAND JURORS DRAWN SETTING MADE OF A GREAT MANY CASES.

Some of Them of Vital Interest to the Mining Operators of Mercur—Two More Divorces Granted at Provo—Newsp Items from the Queen of Cache and Other Places.

Tooele, Utah, May 4.—The Third district court convened at Tooele City this morning at 11 o'clock, with Judge Cherry on the bench.

James Hazan vs. Gladstone Gold Mining and Milling company; Great Eastern Mining and Milling company vs. Charles H. Jacobs; J. W. Cory vs. James Hagler et al.; Benjamin Page vs. Paul Dronberg et al.; for June 2. John Gaudry vs. C. F. Baskin, dismissed, for want of prosecution. A. S. Linbeck vs. Ophir Hill Mining and Co. Contracting company, dismissed. J. H. Delamar et al. vs. Helen P. Blinn vs. J. F. Connor; demurrer with judgment and settled by decree. Sully Slater vs. J. A. Yellette; decree of partition granted. Plaintiff vs. Kayser vs. J. A. Yellette; transferred to Salt Lake for trial. J. R. Delamar vs. John B. Gries et al.; settled by stipulation and decree of distribution.

Thomas J. Bryan vs. Mercur Gold Mining and Milling company; set for May 10. State vs. E. W. Rodeback; adultery; fine reduced to \$500 and set for trial May 10. State vs. Bowen; dismissed by county attorney for lack of evidence. State vs. Perry; Terpenning; dismissed by county attorney on the ground of insanity of defendant. State vs. Philip Raleigh; assault with intent to kill; information filed; defendant allowed \$1500 to appear and plead.
