NINE INCHES OF SOLID ORE IN WHICH THE YELLOW METAL IS PLAINLY VISIBLE.

When the superintendent of the New Sixty mine, which is located at the mouth of Little Cottonwood, came into the city yesterday his arrival caused considerable hilarity and good feeling among the miners and stockholders of the company because of the fact that he brought in with him samples of quartz from the mine that were well sprinkled with the yellow metal, and furthermore because he was able to report that the pay streak of this class of ore had widened out to nine inches, and that as depth was attained the indications were that the chute of rich mineral would gradually increase until the mine would blossom out as a regular dividend payer.

Several readings have been kept in regard to the operations at the New State and they will be pleased to learn that the appearance of the property at the present time certainly justifies the belief that it is the making of a rich gold producer.

Some time ago when work was resumed in the development of this property a five-foot streak of gold quartz that had been left standing in the upper tunnel was broken down along the course of the tunnel for a distance of 40 feet and an upward of 100 feet to a height of 18 feet. Sinking from the tunnel level was then commenced and this mine is now down eight or nine feet, and in the bottom the pay streak has widened out to nine inches and the indications are that it will continue to increase in size as depth is attained, until a good sized body of mineral is disclosed, and there is hardly any doubt but that this strong ledge will lead to something better.

This is a good shipping proposition, in fact, it is high grade lead ore—and Mr. Schenck, who went out to the mine yesterday, will begin bringing down mineral at once from the new discovery for shipment, and it is believed and hoped that from this time on the Dalton & Lark will again enter the list as a heavy shipper.

According to Mr. Schenck the other portions of the mine are looking well, and should the mineral advance in solid form along on schedule time the output of the property will be materially increased.

The Dalton & Lark company is still figuring on a schedule for the mine, and orders have been issued to send a trial lot of ore from the mine to Denver for experimental purposes, and it may be that within the course of a few months the corporation will be treating its own ore on the ground.

STOCKTON MINING NEWS.

Favorable Showing in the Mines of the Camp.

Stockton, July 17.—The development work being done on the Lion group of five claims on Lion hill, Rush valley mining district, by Mr. James Milchenner, is progressing nicely. Mr. Milchenner is drifting south from the 400 foot level to catch a large iron ore body that shows on the surface. Some ore has been uncovered, and the prospects for a bright future for the Lion property are very encouraging.

The Leonore, operated under a lease from Messrs. Shaughnessy and McMillan, of Salt Lake, by Alex. Mase and William Wilson, is looking well. A drift is being run west on the 200 level, and a fine streak of ore is being struck north and south there, 50 feet distant. Considerable ore is being taken out, carrying values of 60 per cent lead, 25 ounces silver and a trace in gold. The mine is now down 100 feet to the south. It is said to state, in connection with this property, that Mr. Mase is lying very ill from a complication of diseases superinduced by lead poisoning.

Mr. L. T. Brockbank, manager of the Black Diamond mine, states that his property continues to hold its own. The mine is now down 100 feet and the 10 inch streak of galena ore carries values of 65 per cent lead, 25 ounces silver and \$4 in gold. At the 100 foot level a fine showing of milling ore is displayed. Mr. Brockbank has made arrangement to handle the water which has recently appeared in the incline.
