HAWAIIANS BECOME CITIZENS

JUST SO SOON AS ANNEKATION TAKES PLACE.

Provision Applies to Portuguese—As Well as All Other Foreigners—Senator Morgan Interviewed.

INDIANS' INTERMARRIAGE. Names of Numerous Tribes and Their Relations to Each Other. Chantauquan: The Tsimpsians are composed of the following tribes: Crow, Bear, Whale, Frog, Wolf, Beaver and Eagle. Each of these represents a family or tribe corresponding to the clan Campbell's of Scotland, or the Nakamurus of Japan. Each tribe has its own crest, as in Japan at this day. A member of the Wolf tribe has the wolf for his crest and the Bear has the bear and stars, showing his celestial origin. An Indian may not marry one of his own crest. But he may marry into any other clan except an allied tribe. A Crow may marry into any tribe except the Frog; the Frog into any but the Crow; the Whale into any but the Bear; the Bear any but the Whale, the Beaver any but the Eagle, the Eagle any but the Beaver, and the Wolf, being from all its ancestry, may marry into any tribe. Suppose a Wolf marries a Crow woman, the children are all Crows. They are named after the mother, not after the father. In quarrels between two tribes, as the Wolf and the Crow, the
