


THIS MAY TURN OUT TO BE THE IDEAL NAVAL CRAFT.

Oakland, Cal., March 10.—Dan Griffin of Portland served as a chopping-block for Lon Agnew in his fight round before the arena tonight. The referee awarded the fight to Agnew in the fifth round, but Griffin was anxious for more trouble, and the crowd urged him on, so the men came together again.

Victory for the colored man in the sixth and the referee counted him out, although he was down but nine seconds. There was a protest, and the fight was resumed, but the chief of police stepped in and stopped the affair, Agnew being awarded the final decision.

Every indication early in the battle was in favor of the white fighter, but when the men got their blood well heated, hard slugging, intermixed with hard wrestling, was the order of the day. On points the fight should have been awarded to the colored man, he landing three times to the Australian's once.

The latter proved himself a perfect glutton for punishment. His only aim was to land a full arm swing on the negro's jaw, and in his extreme glee he lowered his guard to such an extent that the colored fighter was permitted to overtake and destroy the smaller and slower torpedo boats, which are entirely unarmed, with the guns. The 15-pound gun discharges a continuous stream of 10-inch projectiles, which are heavy enough to seriously cripple an ordinary gunboat, much more a torpedo boat. They have a high forward speed, relying upon their speed to get away from the big vessels. There are 44 of these boats building for the British government, eight for Japan and a number for Germany.
