

RUN BY THE WOMEN

Federation Conventions Is a Strictly Feminine Affair.

Massachusetts volunteers started for the shore, and by noon probably 3,000 men had been landed. The men were following as rapidly as the steam launches could be made available.

The president, Mrs. Ellen Henroin of Chicago, with a beaming face and brilliant gown, was the conspicuous figure on the stage. Surrounding her were the officers of the general federation and the speakers of the entire convention, who were admitted to these places of honor by virtue of bright red tickets.

The colors of the federation, white and pale blue, fluttered from everywhere. Great streamers hung from the dome and connected at the top balcony with festoons of the stars and stripes. The decorations were designated by satin banners of gorgeous hue. The stage was banked with palms and flags, and at every turn there evidences of the club woman patriot.

This assemblage was strictly feminine, from the tiny girls who served as pages to the women physicians who were on hand in case any of the speakers were old fashioned enough to faint.

OPENED ON TIME.

Promptly on time, and in a strictly parliamentary manner, the convention opened with a storm of applause. With difficulty the women were reduced to silence, whereupon an experienced woman in the gallery insisted that the speakers-at-arms be pressed into service. That squelched the talkers for a time, but from time to time they would break out, which precipitated hisses from the women who did not mean to miss a single thing.

There was a funny time in seating the delegations. Some women not entitled to seats managed to insinuate themselves into the reserved sections, whereupon the women who were turned out into the cold. This through was induced to make up an overflow meeting at Unity church.

After invocation by Rev. Celia Parker Wooley of Chicago, addresses of welcome were given by Alva Adams, governor of Colorado; T. S. McMurray, mayor of Denver; Mrs. M. D. Thatcher, president of the National Federation; and Mrs. Senator Platt, president of the Denver Women's club.

The response by Mrs. Henroin was warmly received. In a touching and effective manner she expressed her appreciation of her reception. These speeches were followed by important reports on the progress of the local biennial committee, by Mrs. James B. Grant of Denver, the committee on credentials, by Mrs. William H. Kistler of Denver, the secretary of the general federation, Mrs. C. P. Barnes of Louisville, the corresponding secretary, Mrs. Philip N. Moore of St. Louis.

Following the morning session an elaborate buffet luncheon was given in honor of Mrs. Henroin at the residence of Mrs. Thatcher, the hostess, including the speakers, the general federation officers and state presidents.

Club women with pleasure privileges broke up an important business session of the general federation this afternoon. After bumping up against parliamentary tactics, the women closed the hour with a free trolley ride, the worn-out delegates bolted in a body. Prior to this several important matters were considered, chief of which was the election of the delegates' powers. It being decided one delegate could cast the vote of only one club.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

The report of the corresponding secretary, Mrs. Philip N. Moore of St. Louis, was interesting. The federation now includes 56 clubs, with a membership of 60,000, and 30 state federations, made up of 2,110 clubs, with a membership of 125,000. Taking into account the memberships, it leaves 194,000 women in the country pledged to the motto, "Unity in Diversity." There is an honorary membership of 100,000. It was also mentioned that the greatest success of state federations had been among the lines of education, traveling libraries, art and dramatic societies, and manual training for women.

The committee on credentials, Mrs. William H. Kistler of Denver, showed the registration of 100,000 women, or 25 per cent larger than the last biennial.

SEVERE RESISTANCE.

Spaniards Hope Liners Will Repel the Americans.

London, June 22.—The Madrid correspondent of the Standard says that the government suppressed the chief part of the dispatch of the governor of Santiago de Cuba (General Duffield) regarding the forces, disposition of defense and provisions at the moment of actual landing. The information was suppressed because it was so imminent that the Americans would be expected to land at the mouth of the bay, where the Spanish fleet was simultaneously with landing to outflank the Americans if allowed by the elements of the fleet. Then, if successful, they will move forward for a decisive struggle at the mouth of the bay, where the Spanish fleet was expected to co-operate with the defenses.

The resistance is likely to be severe and prolonged. Indeed, the Spanish naval and military forces are being reinforced, to repel the Americans, who will then be in a precarious position on the most unhealthy part of the island. It is provisioned for several weeks, and the authorities have taken possession of all the food stores, and are endeavoring to lay a mine, or a formidable cable, across the bay.

BODIES NOT MUTILATED.

Official Report From the Surgeon at Guantanamo.

Washington, June 22.—Surgeon General Van Rensselaer of the navy has received full reports from the surgeon with Admiral Sampson's fleet who were cared for the dead and wounded participants in the Guantanamo campaign. The report contains a definite statement that the corpses were not mutilated, but that the severe wounds attributed to mutilation were the result of a Mauter rifle ball.

MORE MINES STRUCK.

American Warships Escaped Destruction by a Miracle.

Playa del Este Cable Station, Guantanamo, Province of Santiago de Cuba, Tuesday, June 22.—The Spanish fleet has been quiet for two days, but stirring events are expected soon. The launches of the United States fleet, under the command of Admiral Cervera, dragged the channel leading to the town of Calmanera and

turned up seven contact mines, each containing 112 pounds of gunpowder. The mines were exactly similar to those found on Sunday night by the USS Albatross and every one had been laid by one of our boats on the occasion of the escape of the American warships was little short of providential. The mines were exploded by the USS Albatross, under charge of Lieutenant Boughner, and the USS Dolphin, under the command of Lieutenant Cole, who directed the launches, was dangerous and was very handsomely done by the young officers.

AN IMMEDIATE ADVANCE.

Expected That Santiago Will Be Captured by Saturday.

Off Juraguá, Province of Santiago de Cuba, Wednesday Morning, June 22, by the Associated Press Dispatch Boat to Port Antonio, Jamaica, Thursday, June 23, 1 a. m.—The troops under Major General Shafter this morning began landing at Juraguá, ten miles east of the entrance to Santiago harbor. The Spanish fleet, under the command of Admiral Cervera, will have fallen, either captured or destroyed.

Spanish Admiral Will Make a Dash for Liberty.

New York, June 22.—A special dispatch from Santiago de Cuba, June 20, via Kingston, Jamaica, today says that Admiral Cervera has made a dash for liberty. He is reported to have been seen in the bay of Santiago harbor at the first favorable opportunity. The Spanish warships, it is reported, have been ordered to make a dash for the open sea. It is said to be the intention of the Spanish fleet to make a dash for the open sea, and to attempt to reach the island of Cuba.

BUYING COAL IN CHILL.

Cadiz Squadron May Attack the Pacific Coast.

Washington, June 22.—News has reached here that 12,000 tons of coal is being loaded at Valparaiso, Chile. As coal is worth about \$18 a ton there, the purchase is a great one. It is here, and it has been suspected that it was being made on Spanish account. If this should prove to be true—and it is not unlikely to be so—it would seem to indicate a purpose on the part of the Spanish fleet to make a dash for the Pacific coast.

UNITED STATES AGGRESSION.

Madrid Learns That Other American Republics Are Scared.

London, June 22.—The Madrid correspondent of the Daily Mail says: Reliable information has been received in diplomatic circles here from South America that preliminary steps are being taken to summon a conference of all South and Central American republics to consider the advisability of adopting defensive measures against future aggression by the United States. The Hispano-American republics are expected to send a delegation to the conference.

THREE MURDERERS HANGED.

All Negroes and Guilty of Atrocious Crimes.

Jefferson City, Mo., June 22.—Tobe Latham and Ed McKenize, negroes, were hanged at 9:30 a. m. today. A high stockade had been built about the scaffold in the jail yard, and the negroes were present at the execution. McKenize killed a farmer for his money. Latham murdered a woman and her child after assaulting her.

TELEGRAPHIC BRIEFS.
