The Queen mine, one of the group, has a shaft 45 feet deep, 47, that is in first-class ore. Pocket pieces of 400 and 200 weight of 70 percent copper is being extracted from the shaft.

THE LA SAL MOUNTAINS.

Interesting Letters From the Miners' Basin Country.

Gid R. Propper, writing from Miners' Basin, in the La Sal mountains, Utah, to the Denver Mining Reporter, says: There is probably no new mining section in the western country of which there is so little known as the La Sal district, bordering on the western part of Colorado.

Probably the most important feature of the district, which has developed during the last 90 days, is the growing conviction of almost all the prospectors that there are INEXHAUSTIBLE RESERVES of low grade gold bearing ores, which the zone or belt is now disclosing.

If all the ore bearing material is taken into account, which lies between the surface croppings and the bed of what is known as the silver ledge, an average distance of 150 feet, and the belt extending through the entire district, it will readily be seen that there is an immense body of ore undeveloped, practically untouched.

The location of Miners' Basin is a natural townsite, at the foot of Mineral mountain, the heart of the north division of the main range.

It has been found that gold is present in all the different layers from the upper vein as far down as development has extended, some of the layers being much richer than the others and on these rich chutes most of the work has been done.

The continued effort to reduce the cost of handling the ore has resulted in cutting down the expense to between \$1 and \$1.20 per ton, while the per cent of loss has been cut down to from 80 cents to \$1 per ton.

From the above it will be seen that with a slight increase in the cost of ore will pay the expense of handling and with larger plants and the working of open cuts the expense can be still further reduced.

This view of the case opens up a future for Mercur, undreamed of by the most enthusiastic supporters of the camp, but it is on these lines that investigations are being made by the London Exploration company and other corporations of a similar nature.
