DEPOSITORS WOULD LOSE NO CONSIDERATION SHOWN FOR THEIR INTEREST... Under All Plans Proposed the Losses in Redemption of Notes of Insolvent Banks Would Fall Upon the Depositors—The Present System Should Be Maintained.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 4.—The annual report of Charles G. Dawes, comptroller of the currency, for the year ended Oct. 31, has been sent to congress. The comptroller states that he does not review in his details the plans for the modification of the currency and banking systems, which are now the subject of economic and general discussion throughout the country.

FUNCTION OF BANKS... The comptroller then says: It must be remembered that the primary object of government finance, bank note issues secured only by commercial assets of banks, is to provide a ready means of circulation for the government.
