HEALTH OFFICER TALKS TO BIG CROWD AT THE THEATRE.

Dr. King Was Indignant Over the Failure to Accede to the Proclamation of the City Board of Health—Talks Instituting Proceedings in the Matter.

All of the ward Sunday schools of the Mormon church, as well as the Christian Scientist Sunday school, assembled yesterday as usual. Similar gatherings at the Protestant churches were abandoned, pursuant to the direction of the board of health.

Health Officer King, who signed the order prohibiting the meetings, expressed regret last night that the request had not been complied with. "I haven't investigated the law governing the case," said he, "but I shall look into it tomorrow, and if there is any way for those people to be punished, I will certainly institute proceedings. If they were law-abiding people and wished to co-operate with the board of health in its desire to reduce the responsibility of a smallpox epidemic to a minimum, they would have closed their schools as did the other denominations."

FOUR PLAY NOW FEARED BELIEF THAT THEY WERE WAY-LAID.

Mrs. Penney Has Sent Her Son and Other Parties to the Wah Wah Range to Institute a Rigid Search For Her Husband and Her Missing Boy.

Penney of Kanosh, in which she states that no word of her lost husband and son has yet reached her, and the conviction is expressed that they must still be somewhere in the Wah Wah mountains where they went to prospect for a couple of weeks in November last, and from which section they were known to have started on Saturday the first of the year.
