

FITCH FOR SENATOR

Reason Why "Silver-Tongued" Locates Here. HANNAITES WANT HIM WILL HAVE NO REPUBLICAN OPPOSITION.

Merely as a Way of Showing His Gratitude to the State of Deseret, Tom Will Let Utah Elect Him Senator If the Legislature Is Republican.
