U. P.'s General Freight Agent Tells of Wyoming Cut-off.

FINISHED THIS YEAR

EXCEPTING THE SHERMAN HILL AND PIEDMONT TUNNELS.

Elmer H. Wood, general freight agent of the Union Pacific railroad, arrived in the city yesterday afternoon and in the evening at the Knutsford. When seen last night Mr. Wood said his trip here at this time has no particular significance attached to it. He is here for a vacation more than anything else. He has not been in Salt Lake for nearly three years and he had a desire to take a look at the improvements being made along the main line in Wyoming, where the construction of new cut-offs and a general straightening of the route is in the order of the day. The work will be pretty well finished up by the end of the year, Mr. Wood states, with the exception of the Sherman Hill and Piedmont hill tunnels, where a large amount of heavy work has to be done. The work will take nearly a year to complete, it is hardly probable, anyway, that the tunnels will be open before next year.

GREAT RAILWAY SYSTEMS.

Interesting Table Showing Their Rank by Mileage. (Railway Age) The beneficent work of concentrating many small and often unprofitable and inefficient railroads into few large and well managed systems has been going on with surprising rapidity in the last few years. Hundreds of roads that started out on an independent career have gone through bankruptcy and foreclosure and have passed into the control of companies able to operate them successfully. Hundreds more have become parts of important systems by lease or purchase and are now being operated with interest in their securities, and others still have been built under separate charters and in due time amalgamated with the parent company. So by natural consolidation the evolution of systems has gone on, to the advantage generally of the individual proprietors and to the benefit of the public by improvement in transportation facilities and the railway manager now handles thousands of miles more efficiently than he could have done with his little lines of a few hundred miles before the era of expansion.

It is time to ascertain to what extent the system of consolidation has progressed, and for that purpose the Railway Age has undertaken to tabulate a list of all the railway companies in the United States and Canada, which control over 2,000 miles of line. The figures as will be seen below, that over 10,000 miles of road are now controlled, either by direct operation or through lease, by eight or nine systems, and that several of the systems have already passed the surprising figure of 10,000 miles each, without any indication that the limit has been reached.

The following table shows the mileage controlled on July 1, 1900, by each of the companies named, including track and other facilities. It is understood that the figures will serve to correct various erroneous answers that have been given to the question, which are the largest railway systems in point of mileage and they will also show, also, the relative magnitude of the principal roads, that some notable changes in position have occurred since the last year, the result of recent purchase and lease.

DATE PALMS FROM SAHARA TRANSPLANTED IN ARIZONA

A traveler from the hot sands of the Sahara has just returned to the department of agriculture with some valuable collections, and what is more to the point for this story, an interesting account of his experiences in the desert. The long journey was made to bring to this country for transplanting to Arizona some of the finest species of date palms. Dates are now grown in Arizona in small quantities. The early settlers planted seeds and from these a few trees which bear fruit have sprung up, under very adverse conditions. It was thought at one time that the date palm was introduced from the Arabs never raised from the seed—excellent results might be obtained in Arizona, as the climatic conditions are favorable.

TEMPERATURE OF THE SAHARA.

PHILIPPINE COMMISSION WILL ASSUME CHARGE TONIGHT.

Philippine Commission Will Assume Charge Tonight. Manila, Aug. 5.—On September 1 the commission, headed by Judge Taft, will become the legislative body of the Philippines.
