BURLINGTON'S SALT LAKE LINE. SIOUX CITY INTERESTED IN THE PROJECT.

Will Give That City Connection With Salt Lake—Great Northern's Interests.

The following dispatch from Sioux City indicates that the promised railroad development is attracting considerable attention toward Utah:

A railroad official, who visited Sioux City recently in connection with the proposed extension of the Burlington to Salt Lake City and the completion thereby of a trans-mountain line.

It was said by him that at Salt Lake the Burlington intends to connect with the Salt Lake-Los Angeles line, which is planned by Senator W. A. Clark of Montana.

It means a transcontinental steam line to the Black Hills and connections there to the Pacific northwest by way of the Great Northern.

A considerable part of the general plan of the Burlington has already been carried out. The past season the Burlington has extended its line by way of a constructed nearly 200 miles of road which will be used as a part of the Salt Lake line, and the gap now to be filled is insignificant.

The new lines and connections will enable the Great Northern to connect with Sioux City and Salt Lake City, to do business on the south Pacific coast, and a reciprocal arrangement will enable the Burlington to do business on the Pacific coast by way of the Great Northern system.

The Burlington wants to get into the city because it wants to handle livestock from its western Dakota and Montana territory to this market.
