Exalted Ruler Fred, when called on at headquarters in the Kenyon, was beaming with smiles over the way in which Salt Lake views the outcome of the Milwaukee battle.

When we got there, about thirty or forty trucks, it looked for all the world like Saratoga or Baltimore. We were unpledged in any of the battles, and when the big came on for grand exalted ruler, we still kept our fists out of it.

As soon as the grand exalted ruler was chosen I got a copy of a label, "Shin me to Salt Lake-1902." These were given to the Salt Lake boys for distribution, and while we made very little noise about it, I give you my word there wasn't a man, woman or child connected with the Elks at Milwaukee who didn't wear one.

When I got up and nominated Salt Lake, I stood for all that, and I was doing. We knew that the delegates would give a whole lot more good than the big fellows had spent thousands in advertising and each was as confident of success as they were that Salt Lake would never finish in the race.

Others Were Not In It. In the first and only ballot Charleston got about 50 votes, Saratoga 265, Baltimore about 255 and Salt Lake 265. We attained them all a mile apart.

When the convention got over the shock we had the parade, four miles long, and only Elks at it. I believe the grand lodge session will bring here at least 15,000 Elks and nearly that many visitors.

There were 35,000 strangers in Milwaukee, and it was a grand thing through further away, is just as good as having memorandums of over 400 names that I am to engage right now for different delegations to come.

JUDGE HALL DECIDES Husband Gets Deceit and Custody of Child.

ADULTERY NOT PROVEN CHILD CANNOT BE TAKEN FROM STATE.

The Vail divorce case, that created a small sensation in this city last February, was decided yesterday by Judge W. C. Hall in favor of the husband, Elmer Vail, who secured custody of the child, a decree of divorce and will not be required to pay alimony to the divorced wife, Edith Vail.

Judge Hall has had this case under advisement from the time the trial was closed in February. The finding of the court is that the defendant, the Bowler, who lives on West Temple street, that played so important a part at the trial, did not constitute adultery.

The child is to be given into the custody of Mr. and Mrs. W. W. Gee and supported by the father. Both father and mother are to be permitted to visit the child at all reasonable times.
