Mrs. Van Kuran Fainted When Verdict Was Read.

Arthur J. Van Kuran was found guilty late yesterday afternoon of the offense of embezzling \$8,000 from the Oregon Short Line Railroad company last February.

The jury, occupying until after the noon hour with a characteristically able argument Judge Stewart charged the jurors at length, and at 1:10 they retired.

After going for luncheon in charges of waiting the jurors went to the room allotted to them. Here, from 2 o'clock until 4:35, the eight men in whose minds rested the fate of the defendant, deliberated upon a verdict.

There was the greatest suspense among the friends of the defendant. The end of about half an hour one of the bailiffs came down for some of the jurors from the first to the second. This was regarded as an ill omen.

Later the bailiff returned to ask Judge Stewart if of some people gathered in the verdict a recommendation of defendant to the mercy of the court.

The answer was that the verdict would be proper if the jury so agreed.

Finally the jury filed into court to the foreman of the jury, guilty as charged, without a recommendation for mercy.

There was a hush all through the courtroom when the verdict was declared. The effect of the announcement was most distressing to defendant and his friends.
