

FLOWING WELL IN FOSSIL LAND Wyoming Paraffine Oil Co. Taps Flow With Prospecting Rig.

PAYMENT ON O. K. MINES SAMUEL NEWHOUSE RETURNS FROM FRISCO AND GOES EAST.

(Special to The Herald.) Ogden, Oct. 6.—Word today from Fossil, Wyo., to the effect that oil had been struck by the Wyoming Paraffine Oil company of Pocatello, in their well on section 26, one mile south of the old Clark wells. The oil is of dark brown color and good quality. The information was given by a telegram to Ogden parties from P. L. Griffin of the company, an experienced oil man, who has been through the California oil field excitement.

SAMUEL NEWHOUSE DEPARTS. He Visited Both the Royal and Horn Silver Mines.

Coleman, and M. M. Johnson of his engineering staff, divided the time in the Beaver country camp between an inspection of the Royal company's copper property and the Horn Silver.

RICHES OF NEW RAMBLER. A Wyoming Copper Mine That is Attracting Attention.

Laramie, Wyo., Oct. 5.—The phenomenal richness of ore from the Rambler copper mine in the Douglas Creek district and the big profits accruing to the company from its operations has caused stock in the concern to advance steadily in price. A little over a year ago the stock reached its par value of \$200 per share. About nine months ago three shares sold for \$400 and the transaction created a stir in local mining circles.

PAYMENT ON O. K. MINES. Money Arrived For That Purpose Yesterday.

that works for making a pure concentrate are to be erected at some point on the Arkansas river—Canon City or Pueblo. The company engaged in this enterprise has been located, and the Guggenheims appear to be in control. The smelter will be of sufficient capacity to treat not only the zinciferous ores of Leadville district, but of other sections where it is found sufficiently rich to bear transportation. The projectors evidently feel that there is money in works of this character. They are fully experienced and know what can be done with the products of Leadville. Leadville, Idaho, Robinson, Kokomo, Battle Mountain, in the Eagle and other camps, and will proceed with a distinct understanding of the results. A. J. Davis, located in this city, was the prime mover in this scheme, and he was incited to it by long familiarity with the several zinc producing fields. It was he who first opened a market for this class of mineral at Leadville two years ago last June.

In view of the prevalence of such ores in nearly all our largely producing districts, it is a matter of great importance that effective means are to be taken to develop them in a wholesale and at profit to the miner greater than has been afforded at any previous time. The low price largely has been due to the long haul by rail and shipping charges to foreign markets.

PARK CITY MINING NOTES. Operations at Bogan, Steamboat and Other Promising Properties.

LONDON STOCKS LOWER. Tight Money and Copper Scare the Causes—Future Looks a Little Brighter.

London, Oct. 6.—A certain tightness in money not quite anticipated, the after effects of the copper scare and the adverse reports regarding the war in South Africa, all tend to create the slight decline that marked the stock exchange last week. Public interest was also continued, and the markets were pretty much left to themselves. Although some gold is still expected to go to New York, the demand here thus far been comparatively unimportant, the arrivals from the Cape and other points being fully able to make up any drain.

RECOVERY IN BERLIN. Stocks Go Higher—American Rails in Demand.

Berlin, Oct. 6.—The first half of last week brought a moderate recovery in prices, for which the cause was offered in the reports from the industrial centers. During the latter half of the week the bourse relapsed into its former pessimistic attitude. Yesterday's falls in industrials were quite heavy. American railroads were in better demand, as also were Canadians.

MORE OIL BOILING OUT. (Mt. Pleasant Pyramid.)

CALL THE WAR A FAKE. Berlin Newspapers Say South American Conflict Exists Only in the Imagination.

Berlin, Oct. 6.—The Hamburgische Correspondente publishes the surprising statement that the Venezuelan consul in Hamburg, whose authority is the Venezuelan minister in Paris, declares the reports of war and revolution from South America to be false, and alleges that peace is undisturbed, adding that President Castro believes such rumors are spread by the United States in order to side-track European interests.

The Lokal Anzeiger, under the caption "A War Comedy," says: "While the Boers are fighting desperately across the Atlantic a military-political comedy is being performed. War was declared, as soon as the Colombian troops were ordered to explain to Europe." "While it is true that the American press is inclined to mislead Europe regarding western affairs, it is not to be remembered that President Castro's attack was reported by a French war correspondent. The assertions of the modern Boerist are futile."

ARMIES FACE TO FACE. Still Not a Shot is Exchanged by Rival Hosts.

Caracas, Venezuela, Oct. 6.—An envoy of the Venezuelan government, who has just arrived at Maracibo from the Colombian frontier, wires the correspondent of the Associated Press at Caracas as follows: "For two days the Venezuelan troops concentrated between San Cristobal and Cucuta, estimated to be about 10,000 men, fired a single shot against the Colombians massed before them under the command of General Valencia, and estimated at 6,000. The extra weapons remained continually at 'shoulder arms.'"

SADNESS IN JAPAN. Mourning for McKinley Widespread—Events in Yankee Nation of the Orient.

Yokohama, Sept. 21.—The tidings of the death of President McKinley came as a great shock to the foreign community as well as to the entire nation, and the day of the funeral was one of general mourning, business being almost suspended. Indeed, President McKinley has called forth whatever still remained latent in the feeling of warm friendship with the United States, and the Standard Oil interest was regularly in expressions of grief and sympathy.
