

GREAT STRIKES IN THE STAR CON.

Full Breast of Galena Cut on 275 Level Yesterday.

GOLD CHUTE 18 INCHES WIDE RUNS FROM \$400 TO \$1,000 PER TON.

The Herald's correspondent at Mammoth telephoned in last evening that during the day a most sensational strike had been made in the Star Consolidated, and that there was no small amount of rejoicing in the ranks of the mine forces who came down to attend in a. in consequence, in a drift on the 275 level a full breast of galena ore had been broken into and assays made in the afternoon showed average values of 56 per cent lead and seventy ounces silver per ton. What gold, if any, was in the ore, had not been determined when The Herald's informant got down to Mammoth, but he said the strike had all the earmarks of being the most important ever made in the mine.

BACK FROM THE CACTUS.

Engineer Johnson Thinks of Development There and at Blackbird. M. M. Johnson, engineer in charge of Samuel Newcomb's Cactus at Pioche, has returned from a seven days' trip to camp, and speaks most enthusiastically of conditions of the property. The big triple-compartment shaft is now 440 feet on its way down to the 600-foot level, and as a sample of the progress made in the shaft, the engineer says, with as fine a lot of miners as he ever saw at work, dropped the big hole down in the solid granite 163 feet in thirty days—a record he believes is close to the top for hand drill work in the meantime drifting and crosscutting is being pushed on the 300 level, and the prospect of improvement in the ore bodies is phenomenal.

BEST MONEY IN THE MINING SUIT.

Question of Veracity Between Sam McIntyre and Reed Smoot. GRAND CENTRAL CASE SHOWING MADE BY EXPERT TYLER FOR DEFENDANT.

(Special to The Herald.) Nephew, Jan. 21.—The Grand Central-Mammoth case today, a very interesting question of veracity arose between Reed Smoot, vice president of the principal owners in the Grand Central of the ore on the one hand, and Samuel McIntyre, president and chief owner in the Mammoth mine on the other.

Reed, I am a friend of yours and I hate to see you spend money here (referring to the Silveropolis and Consort claims of the Grand Central), for you will never find any ore, nor will you find anything there. The Mammoth company has the idea of using gold dollars and never could find any ore whatever going to the west.

McIntyre Denies It. To those questions Mr. McIntyre replied that he had not made such statements to Mr. Smoot. Reed Smoot then called and asked the question of the statement quoted was made to him by Mr. McIntyre during the year 1896, and replied positively "Yes," that Mr. McIntyre had made such a statement to him.

Director's Verdict. The claim of the Grand Central is that the bodies in question are in an ore channel which enters the south end of the Grand Central claims on its course or strike after passing through the south end of Mammoth lot 28 on a general strike north and westerly and does not return again to lot 28, and being within the boundary lines of the Grand Central claims extended northward, belong to that company.

That Wooden Model Again. Counsel for the Grand Central again endeavored to put in evidence the wooden model used by the Mammoth company in its claim, but the court refused to admit it, on the ground that it was not a true model of the mine as claimed, but a model of the mine as it appeared to be only a part of the testimony of certain witnesses.

Grand Central Case Closed.
