

ULTIMATUM TO STRIKERS GIVEN

Electricians Must Return to Work by Tuesday Morning.

WILL BE THEIR LAST CHANCE

OTHERWISE THEIR POSITIONS WILL BE DECLARED VACANT.

At a meeting of the Contracting Electricians' association yesterday afternoon the members of the organization drafted an ultimatum to the striking wiremen, notifying them that if they failed to return to work under the old regime by Tuesday morning next, their positions would be declared vacant and filled by other men. The contractors propose to give the strikers a last chance to return to work, but if they don't, they propose to elect them to a final, backed by the non-union men now at work, who are the limit of the action taken by the non-union cooks and waiters, are themselves settling the matter of organization for their own protection. This is done the warfare in electrical circles will devolve itself into a triangular affair.

The meeting at which the ultimatum was adopted was held in the office of the Salt Lake Electric & Supply company, and all the contractors were present. It was the unanimous opinion of the meeting that one more chance should be afforded the strikers to return to work, and as a result, the following notice to the union men was issued:

Notice to the Union. We feel it our duty to explain the reasons why we refuse compliance with the demands of our employees who are now on a strike to enforce them.

First—They demand (not request) 50¢ per day, for 40 days' work of eight hours. This rate is excessive, considering the class of work performed in comparison with other trades. For instance, the electric light linemen receive \$1 per day of nine hours. His occupation is an exceedingly dangerous one, as he is constantly working amid high tension live wires, and should, by accident, lose his balance while upon a pole, and try to save himself by grasping these wires, he would meet instant death.

Second—The union says apprentices should not go on construction fixtures or repair work outside of shops, except under the supervision of a journeyman who is responsible for work done.

This simply means that two men must do the work that could, in many instances, be performed by one.

Resist the Demands. We have banded together to resist compliance with these unreasonable demands, and will fight the proposition to the bitter end.

Applications for work are being made daily by non-union men, but as we have all the men we require at this season of the year, we are compelled to decline their services.

If the men now out do not report for work Tuesday morning next at 8 o'clock, under the old conditions, their places will be declared vacant.

Some of the contractors were in favor of having the ultimatum effect Monday morning and bring matters to an issue immediately, but it was decided to give the men until Tuesday to consider the matter. The contractors believe that the majority of the strikers will look favorably upon the chance to return to work.

While no definite action has been taken by the non-union men working in the places left by the strikers, they are considering the matter of organizing a union themselves, it is said. Their purpose is to protect their own interests.

GIVEN FURTHER TIME.

Extension Granted Six Restaurants to Consider the Situation. The six restaurants that have refused to sign the ultimatum, the Cooks and Waiters' union have been given a week in which to consider the matter of capitulating to the union, and while the cooks and waiters have had no meeting to act upon the matter, it is the general understanding that a strike of all union help in these places will be called at the expiration of this time, unless some agreement is reached.

Upon learning of the action of the Federation in the matter, the proprietors of these restaurants expected that they would be called immediately, but they stated last night that they had been given until the next meeting of the union to make a final decision upon the proposition.

"If we fail to comply with their demands by the end of that time," said one of the proprietors, "the union, we understand, will order a strike of all help in our places, and we also understand that they intend to establish pickets in front of our places to turn away trade. As the non-union men, though, are organizing a union, we have no fears on either score. The new union will back us, and there is no doubt but we will manage to keep business going. As for boycotting us, the kind of the trade we have is not of a kind that can be influenced by any boycott.

The organizers of the non-union union expect their charter to arrive Monday, and they will then hold a meeting in some place to be determined later, to institute the union. The purpose of the new organization, according to the statements of some of the prime movers in it yesterday, is to have its membership consist of cooks and waiters who reside in this city and to have interests here that will make them slow to act upon any proposition that would endanger their situations.

Get All Together.

With reference to the statement in yesterday's Herald that a union of "non-union" cooks and waiters is opposed to the existing unions in its process of organization in this city, F. C. Angell, a recent arrival from Chicago and organizer of the new union, wishes it understood that his purpose is to bring all of the cooks and waiters within the fold of the American Federation of Labor. He declared that he is not antagonistic to the local union, but believes that greater advantage will accrue to the craft by affiliating with the greater federation than to be limited to the local assembly.

Articles of Incorporation.

The J. W. McKean post No. 1, U. A. L., has filed articles of incorporation in the office of the county clerk. The officers are: J. W. Reed, president; Frank H. Clark, secretary and treasurer; Duddell A. H. Depuy, first commander. Under the provisions of the articles of incorporation there are to be seven trustees, inclusive of the departmental commander, three from each of the two posts in this city, as follows: J. W. Reed, H. E. Burns and Thomas Harris of the McKean post, and H. G. Slaughter, A. B. Richardson and Frank H. Clark of the McKean post.

Women Demand the Right to Help Elect Officials.

S. B. ANTHONY'S BIRTHDAY NOTED SUFFRAGIST LEADER IS 82 YEARS OF AGE.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 15.—Interest in the National Woman Suffrage association meeting today was heightened by the fact that it marked the eighty-second birthday of Susan B. Anthony. She was the recipient of many congratulations.

The following message of greeting from the foreign delegates was received by her and read from the platform. "We, the undersigned foreign delegates to the first international woman suffrage conference, gladly take the opportunity of your eighty-second birthday to express to you our love and reverence, our gratitude for your lifelong work for women, and our rejoicing that you have lived to see such great steps onward made by the world at large in the direction in which you led at first under such prejudice. Praying that you may enjoy years of health, cheered by ever-fresh advances, we remain your loving friends. (Signed) Florence Fenwick Miller, England; Sofia Levornis-Friedland, Russia; Carolina-Holman-Holmbo, Ussie; Gudrum Drewsen, Norway; Vida Goldstein, Australia; Erma Ewald, Sweden; Antoinette Stolle, Germany."

Mrs. Boyer of Philadelphia presented a plan of action for the coming year. That part relating to taxation without representation caused considerable discussion, which developed the fact that in paying the taxes a number of the delegates insert the fact that certifies the words "paid under protest."

All Taxpayers Rise. A suggestion by the president that all present that are taxpayers should rise brought to their feet over 200 women. Other recommendations by the committee were that systematic work be done to increase the circulation of suffrage; that presidential suffrage be urged; and that there be a woman's suffrage stamp, similar to that used in France; that prizes be offered for the best essays on woman suffrage and "that we continue our plea for a sixteenth amendment respecting woman suffrage."

Tonight's session was given up to "An Evening With England and Her Colonies." The speakers were Miss Vida Goldstein of Australia, James L. Hughes of Toronto, Canada, and Florence Fenwick Miller of England.

GEORGE M. BATES FREE.

Man Convicted of Manslaughter is Finally Pardoned.

George M. Bates is free at last. In 1895 Bates was indicted for killing John Nordquist in Tooele county, and the following year, after statehood, he was tried by a jury of eight men for murder in the first degree, and convicted of murder in the second degree.

Later, in a similar case, it was held that where a defendant was charged with a crime before statehood, and tried after he was admitted to the same number of jurors as if tried before the law went into effect providing for only eight jurors in all except capital cases, and Bates was released. He was immediately re-arrested, however, and was tried by twelve men, and again convicted. He then appealed to the supreme court, and the matter is now pending before that tribunal. Yesterday the board of pardons took the matter up and decided that Bates had been sufficiently punished, as the second sentence called for only one year in the state prison, and he had served seventeen months on the first sentence. The judge who tried the case and others recommended his pardon.

BOY'S FLESH IS BURIED IN ACID

Quantity of Fiery Liquid Dropped on His Leg.

EATS THROUGH CLOTHING

PROMPT ACTION SAVES HIM FROM SERIOUS RESULTS.

THE thickness of his trousers was probably all that prevented Floyd Kowitz, a messenger boy employed at the A. C. Smith Drug company, from having his right leg, from the knee down, burned seriously by pure nitric acid yesterday afternoon. The liquid fire from an accidentally broken bottle saturated the boy's trousers, burning them like so much paper to which a match had been touched, and severely, though not seriously, burned his limb.

The accident occurred while the boy was handling bottles of the dangerous liquid in the warehouse back of the drug store, about 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Young Kowitz was carrying a seven-ounce bottle of the acid when the bottom suddenly dropped out. The liquid poured over the trousers of the boy from his right leg. In an instant the liquid had burned to a crisp the portion of the trousers it touched, and a considerable quantity of the acid soaked through to the skin, burning the knee and foot in a most painful manner. Had it not been for the thickness of the trousers absorbing so much of the acid, the limb would undoubtedly have been discovered to the bone, as the acid eats the flesh with hungry rapidity.

The cries of agony of the lad attracted the attention of Mr. Smith and an assistant in the warehouse, and the acid-soaked clothing was cut away immediately and a quantity of ammonia was poured over the burned portion to neutralize the action of the acid. J. K. W. Bracken was summoned immediately and oils were applied to the wounds to allay the suffering of the boy and prevent further corrosion of the flesh. The burns cover a large portion of the limb, but the doctor stated that he did not think there would be any serious consequences from the accident.


The boy, suffering excruciating agony, was removed to his home at 767 South Main street, where he is being cared for.

Young Kowitz is 15 years of age, and was working at the store in the place of his older brother, who is suffering from a broken arm which he sustained a short time ago.
