Large Amount of Work is Now in Progress.

NEW CIRCUITS BEING PUT IN

EXTENDING FROM MONTANA TO SOUTHERN UTAH.

On his return from the north, General Manager Murray of the Rocky Mountain Bell Telephone company brought news of the numerous improvements in process to further extend the company's lines of communication in Utah, Idaho, Montana and Wyoming.

Much Work in Wyoming.

Material is arriving, Manager Murray reports for a large amount of extension work in central Wyoming, the intention being to make connection of the line from Salt Lake with Casper, Lander, Thermopolis, Lovell, Cheyenne, and finally northward through the Big Horn country by way of Cody to a junction with the wires running south from Billings, Mont.

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THREE MEN KILLED BY ELECTRICITY

Pravo Man Meets Death While at Work on New Building.

Pravo, Feb. 19.—August Blumenthal, a well known citizen of Pravo, met death about 10 o'clock this morning from an electric shock while working on a galvanic plant on the front of the new building being erected by the Pravo Manufacturing company opposite the postoffice.

Mr. Blumenthal and several other workmen had been on the cornice. While in position, on the adjoining building on the west side, a wire or cable was pulled from where it was supposed to work the wires of the Pravo Electric Light company.

Mr. Blumenthal was struck by the wire and fell from the cornice. He was supported by a brick wall, which also supported Mr. Blumenthal. A circuit was thus formed, and Mr. Blumenthal received the entire current of 5,000 volts. He gave a scream, which was heard by Will Clayton, who was on the building.

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citizenship. They have their own representatives in the Creek Indian legislature, their own schools and their own churches.

The Creek negroes have never progressed above their fathers, who were slaves, except that they are well enough educated to care for their lands as managers, without being cheated out of a goodly portion of it.

Each Creek negro will come into unimpaired possession of 500 acres of land which the Dawley government has allotted their lands pro rata to them some time during the coming summer.

Notwithstanding that many of these Creek negroes are industrious, there are those among them who rent out their estates and lounge in idleness about the railway station. It is a common sight to see a 500-acre tract of rich land in the Canadian bottoms being tilled by a white man, while the negro owner is shooting craps or enjoying a long and independent life in a neighboring village.

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
