Commissioners Decide to Change Bounty Ordinance.

Provo, May 5.—At the meeting of the board of county commissioners held today a petition from P. J. Benson and others was presented asking that the ordinance providing for a bounty to be paid on fish-destroying birds be repealed, and that an ordinance be enacted providing for a bounty of 2 cents each to be paid on English sparrows and 10 cents per dozen on the eggs of English sparrows.
